

Players chosen for all-league

The Goodland Cowboys had one member selected for the Northwest Kansas League all-league team and four players who got honorable mention.

Andrew Melia, a 6 foot, 5 inch, 200-pound senior, was selected as a second-team receiver.

David Russell, a 5-foot, 10-inch, 175-pound senior, was selected for honorable mention as a defensive lineman. Taylor Brack, 5 foot, 10 inch, 174-pound junior, was selected for honorable mention as a defensive end. Sean Greenlee, a 6-foot, 190-pound senior, was selected for honorable mention as a linebacker. Bryan Mai, a 6-foot, 1-inch, 175-pound senior, was selected for honorable mention as a defensive back.

Chris Walters, high school foot-

ball coach, had positive things to say about the all-league selections.

“Those guys did a good job for us this year,” the coach said.

Melia led the league in receiving, he said, with 44 catches for 545 yards. He put forth some extra effort, Walters said, for some of those catches.

The other four Cowboys are from Goodland’s defense. Walters had said early in the season that Goodland would have a strong defense this year, but now says he was disappointed.

“We thought the defense would be stronger,” he said, “but it didn’t turn out that way.”

Injuries really hurt the team, he said. If everyone had stayed healthy, they would have had a strong defense.

Johnson wins award

NEW YORK (AP) — Randy Johnson didn’t have to share this award with Curt Schilling.

The Big Unit, co-MVP of the World Series with his Arizona Diamondbacks teammate, won his third straight National League Cy Young Award on Tuesday, receiving 30 of 32 first-place

votes from a panel of the Baseball Writers’ Association of America.

“I know Curt’s happy for me,” Johnson said. “He was calling me today to thank me for getting him to this next level where’s he at. I thought that was the most flattering comment I’ve received to this point in my career.”

Nuggets did not need to be at best

DENVER (AP) — At times the Denver Nuggets weren’t at their best. Against the Chicago Bulls, they didn’t have to be.

“I wasn’t worried about this one,” said Nick Van Exel, who had 23 points and six assists in Denver’s 101-93 victory Tuesday night. “We found a way to win when we needed to.”

Raef LaFrentz added 18 points and

eight rebounds as the Nuggets held off Chicago. Former Bulls player Scott Williams preserved the win with a basket and two free throws in the final 2:50. He scored 10 of his 16 points in the fourth quarter.

“I thought we played good in stints, but we didn’t play good for 48 minutes,” Van Exel said. “I didn’t think we would have a letdown, and they play

real good.”

The Nuggets also got unexpected help from Shawnelle Scott, who contributed six of his seven points in the fourth quarter. Denver won its third straight game and beat Chicago for the third straight time at home.

Brad Miller had 25 points and 13 rebounds for Chicago, which lost its fourth straight. The Bulls never led
