

Cowgirls drop from sub-state

The Pratt Community College fieldhouse may look like Goodland's Max Jones, but it wasn't very friendly to the Cowgirls Thursday as the Colby Lady Eagles swept them away 55-32 in the second round of Class 4A sub-state play.

With the loss, the Cowgirls ended their season with a 16-6 record. The Lady Eagles, 20-2, will face Scott City in the sub-state championship Saturday. Scott City defeated Larned 35-33 to advance.

This was the third meeting of the two rivals this year, with Colby taking all three. In each game the Cowgirls fell behind early and were unable to mount a comeback.

"We never gave up," said Coach Connie Livengood. "We outplayed them in the second half and I am proud of the kids. They showed good character as a team. It was a disappointing loss, but that happens."

The Cowgirls got the opening tip, but their shots wouldn't fall through the hoop. The girls had several chances in the first minute without any success.

Colby's Ivy Ramsey opened the Lady Eagle scoring with two free throws and they led 2-0. Jessica Osborn's basket a couple of minutes later tied the score at 2, and after that came another Colby basket. Then StevieLee Raymer tied it at 4.

That was the only time the Cowgirls were close, as the Lady Eagles went on an eight point run to lead 12-4 with 3:32 left in the first.

Jayci Stone got her first basket with two minutes left to make it 12-6. That was the last score for the Cowgirls in the quarter, but the Lady Eagles added another eight points to lead 20-6 at the end.

The Cowgirls were in deep trouble. Goodland's Erica Mann hit a basket in the first play of the second quarter to make it 20-8, but the Lady Eagles kept the pressure on and it was 28-8 with 3:03 left.

Mann passed the ball to Raymer and she put up the second Cowgirl basket of the quarter to make it 28-10.

Colby's Summar Stephens hit her third 3-point basket of the half to put the Lady Eagles up 31-10. Moments

later she added another 3-pointer, and with baskets by Ramsey, Emily Sloan and two free throws by Bethanie Linden, the Lady Eagles built a 40-10 lead with less than a minute left.

Stone tried a 3-point shot, but it bounced out and when Hayley Jarmin went for the rebound, she was fouled by Colby's Sloan. Jarmin missed the first free throw, but got the second for the last Cowgirl point of the half. The score was 40-11.

Stone started the third quarter with a flurry, as she hit two straight baskets to make it 40-15. Raymer got two free throws to make it 40-17.

That was the extent of the Cowgirls run as, Colby's Ramsey hit two more free throws and another basket midway through the quarter to make it 44-17.

Anny McCoy hit her first basket with 1:19 left to make it 44-19, but Colby's Stephens got a basket to make it 46-19 at the end of the quarter.

In the final quarter, the Cowgirls tried to get a fast break going with little success. Colby's Amanda Seemann fouled out with 4 minutes left. This put Stephanie Fairbanks at the free throw line for a one-and-one, but she was unable to sink the first shot.

McCoy hit three more baskets in the final four minutes, and Jessica Vignery, Kendra Billinger and Tess Schultz got in the game for the final minutes.

The game ended with a missed shot by the Lady Eagles, who won 55-32.

"We had a good season," Coach Livengood said, "and will look forward to next year. We really appreciate the support of the fans through out the season."

There were no Cowgirls in double figures, with McCoy coming the closest with 9 points, 7 in the fourth. Raymer had 8; Stone 6; Osborn 4; Brenner and Mann 2; and Jarmin 1.

Leading the Lady Eagles was Ramsey with 22 points. Stephens connected on four 3-point shots and finished the game with 18 points. Linden had 5 points, Brianna Swafford and Sloan scored 3 points each. Amanda Seemann and Samantha Wolf each had 2.

The Cowboys play Scott City at 5 p.m. tonight at Pratt Community College in the semi-finals of the boys sub-state.

Rockies chief gets tests

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Colorado Rockies manager Buddy Bell left spring-training on Thursday to return to Denver for followup tests on his back and left leg.

Bell had surgery on Dec. 11 to repair a disk problem and has experienced discomfort in his left leg since the operation..

He has been unable to take part in some of his usual spring-training du-

ties, such as hitting fungoes and throwing batting practice.

Rockies general manager Dan O'Dowd urged Bell to get tests in Denver with the team's doctors, internist Allen Schreiber and orthopedist Thomas Noonan.

O'Dowd said the tests were to determine if the discomfort Bell is experiencing is part of the normal recovery from back surgery.

Rockies tune up

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Juan Uribe drove in three runs with a triple and double, and the Colorado Rockies collected 18 hits to beat the University of Arizona 15-1 on Thursday.

In a tuneup for their official exhibition opener against the San Diego Padres today, the Rockies scored four runs in the first and added six more in the fourth and three in the fifth against the college.

Rockies bench coach Toby Harrah directed the team in the absence of manager Buddy Bell, who departed for Denver to have follow-up tests for the back surgery he underwent on Dec. 11.

John Thomson, expected to be the Rockies' No. 4 starter this season, pitched the first two innings, allowing one hit and striking out three. Jason Jennings and Aaron Cook also threw two scoreless innings apiece.

Royals get pitcher back

HAINES CITY, Fla. (AP) — Royals left-hander Jose Rosado, who has not pitched in nearly two years, threw 20 pitches and retired all four batters he faced Thursday in a Kansas City intrasquad game.

Rosado, a two-time American League All-Star selection, has had two shoulder surgeries the past two years.

"How I evaluate that outing, is wow," Rosado said. "It is more than what I asked of God. I've been asking God to please let me stay healthy, let me go out there and look good, look loose, look comfortable. He gave me more than what I asked him to give me."

"I threw strikes. I was ahead of the count. I threw a 3-2 change up. I threw a 2-2 fastball in to strike out the last guy. I was around the plate after a year and a half (off)."

Rosado retired Donnie Sadler and Joe Espada, the first two hitters, on routine fly balls to the outfield. He struck out Ken Harvey and Scott

Walter to end his outing.

Rosado appeared in two spring training games last year before being shut down on March 19. He underwent a second surgery on his left shoulder on May 30.

"I'm here to show people I'm healthy," Rosado said.

The Royals are not counting on Rosado to be ready for the April 1 opener, but he has other ideas.

"I want to be there the first day and be part of the team, right from the beginning," Rosado said. "That will be my next goal."

Royals manager Tony Muser said it was good to see Rosado on the mound again.

"His velocity wasn't good, but he didn't throw that hard in spring training before the surgeries," Muser said. "Rosado's velocity will go up the more he throws."

Rosado is scheduled to pitch again Monday against the Cincinnati Reds.
