## Dr. Ken Wilcox

Dr. R. Kenneth Wilcox, 78, a Goodland native who became a college professor and dean, died Thursday, March 7, at Kansas City, Mo.

He was born Jan. 29, 1924, in Goodland, the son of Ralph Nelson and Iva Mae Ashlock Wilcox. In November 1970, he married Kay Ellen Johnston.

Following his high school graduation, he joined the U.S. Army and served in North Africa, Italy, France and Germany during World War II, receiving a Purple Heart. After the war, he earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Kansas and a master's and doctorate from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

A clinical psychologist, he taught psychology at the University of Arkansas, the University of Wisconsin and the University of Missouri-Kansas City and was the dean of continuing education at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. After retiring as dean, he moved to Sedalia, Mo., in 1980 and opened a private practice, Wilcox and Associates in Sedalia and Laurie, Mo. He was a member of the American and Missouri Psychological Associations.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Marjorie Nitz.

Survivors include his wife; two sons, David Kenneth Wilcox of Olathe and James Ross Wilcox of San Jose, Calif.; two daughters, Kimberly Lynne Sheek of Leawood and Patricia Lynn Wilcox of Topeka; a sister, Dorothy Taylor of Escondido, Calif.; four grandsons; and a great-grandson.

Services were set for 2 p.m. Monday, March 11, at the McLaughlin Funeral Chapel in Sedalia.
