Dispute ties up federal unemployment money

TOPEKA — A dispute with legislators over paying unemployment benefits is keeping the Department of Human Resources from spending \$4 million in federal funds.

The department contends it needs to spend the money on staff and computer upgrades to improve the processing of unemployment benefits, particularly in the winter.

But Democratic leaders criticized the agency Thursday, saying the money should go directly to the jobless benefits. They suggested during a Statehouse news conference that the department is inefficient.

Until the issue is resolved, the \$4 million will lie idle and cannot be used for anything.

The agency had hoped to win approval of its plans today from the State Finance Council, which includes Republican Gov. Bill Graves and eight legislative leaders. However, legislative opposition caused the department to rescind its request.

“If there isn’t support for it, we’re certainly not going to take it up,” said State Budget Director Duane Goossen.

About 62,000 Kansans were unemployed and actively seeking new jobs in April. Benefits are 60 percent of a worker’s weekly earnings, up to \$333.

In March, the state learned it would receive \$78 million in federal funds under a package of legislation designed to stimulate the national economy and help the unemployed.

The department wants to spend \$3 million of those funds to add up to 60 workers to help process unemployment claims, with another \$1 million going into computer upgrades.

But during their record-long session, legislators objected. They even included a provision in a budget bill that

said the department couldn’t spend any of the money for administrative costs — and the Finance Council couldn’t approve any such spending.

Graves vetoed that provision, but
