Royals' rally too little to beat Expos

MONTREAL (AP) — The Kansas City Royals rallied late and sent the game to extra innings, but it wasn't enough to beat the Montreal Expos, a team slated for possible elimination.

Montreal's Vladimir Guerrero scored on pitcher Scott Mullen's throwing error in the 11th inning Thursday night, helping the Expos extend their winning streak to a seasonhigh seven games with a 5-4 victory over Kansas City.

Fernando Tatis' homer off closer Roberto Hernandez with one out in the ninth made it 4-4, then Montreal went on to put together its longest string since winning 10 straight in June 1997.

"This is awesome — this is amaz-

ing," Tatis said. "Everybody's feeling good. We're winning and we're just putting everything together."

The mood was decidedly less enthusiastic in the Royals' clubhouse as Kansas City lost its season-high seventh in a row despite outhitting Mont-

After the Royals overcame a threerun deficit with four two-out runs in the seventh to take a 4-3 lead, Tatis hit a towering shot just over the wall down the left-field line with one out in the
