During the game with Quinter, two players, Jordan Frazier and Justeen Koehlers scored 9 points for the Cowgirls. Also assisting in the scoring were Bailee Guyer 6; Ciara Abbey 4; Whitney Carmicheal 3; and Megan Leonard, Gami Cloyd, Lisha Tedford, Abby Murray and Melissa Swager, 2 each.

Koehler led with 7 rebounds. Carmicheal had 6; Abbey and Jennifer Mentzer 4; Tedford and Frazier 3; Leonard, Guyer and Swager 2; and Cloyd and Murray 1 each.

Carmicheal, Leonard, Frazier,

Abbey and Tedford tallied one assist each. Carmicheal and Guyer had two steals each, while Megan Sheldon, Frazier, and Abbey each had one. Koehler recorded the only two blocks.

In the game with the Colby Eagles, Sheldon was the standout in scoring, adding 10 points to the score for the Cowgirls. Swager had 7; Abbey 5; Frazier and Koehler 4; Carmicheal 3; Emily Burkett, Leonard and Mentzer 2.

Koehler and Swager led in rebounding by bringing down 6 each. They were followed by Carmicheal 5; Mentzer and Leonard 4; Tedford 3; Abbey 2; and Sheldon and Frazier 1. Leonard, Frazier, Abbey, Mentzer and Tedford had a steal apiece. Mentzer had the only block for the night.

The girls will play Friday in Atwood against the Lady Buffaloes opposite of the varsity boys game, starting about 7 p.m. Mountain Time.
