Goodland softball team splits pair with Colby

The Goodland High girls split a pair of softball games with the Colby Eagles on Friday.

Britany Pettibone pitched the first game, which the Cowgirls won 11-6. She had three strikeouts and gave up five hits, six runs and five walks.

In the second game, Alissa Shields was the pitcher. She gave up five hits, four runs and one walk and had no strike outs. Colby won the encounter 4-3.

In the first game, the girls had three doubles, four singles and walked eight times. In the second game, they had a pair of doubles, seven singles and three walks but could get their runners home.

"Alissa pitched a good game, allowing only one earned run," Coach Terry Daise said. "We couldn't get key hits, stranding 11 runners on base."

Getting doubles for the Cowgirls

were Stephanie Fairbanks, Pettibone and Tammy Weeter in the first game and A. Shields and Weeter in the second.

Singling were A. Shields, Colleen Koehler and Jennifer Mentzer (2) in the first game and Pettibone (2), A. Shields, Shanae Calkins, Tomi Windell, Adrienne Garcia and Cortney Shields in the second.

Calkins and Windell walked twice in the first game while Garcia, Weeter, Koehler and Jennifer Mentzer got one each. In the second game, Fairbanks, Garcia and Weeter got free rides.

Weeter led in runs batted in, getting three runners home in the first game. Fairbanks got two RBIs in the first game and Pettibone, Windell, Garcia, Koehler and Mentzer all got one. In the second game, only Koehler and C. Shields were able to bring players across home plate.

The team will be in Holcomb on Thursday for a 3 p.m. start against the Longhorns.


