Al Lindsten, 82, a Goodland farmer and mechanic, died Tuesday, May 20, 2003, at the Goodland Regional Medical Center.

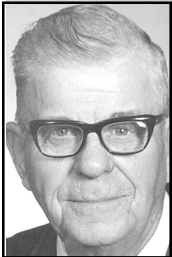
He was born Feb. 27, 1921, at St. Francis, the son of Mattie Maria (Price) and John Weaver Lindsten. His paternal grandparents came from Sweden and homesteaded in Cheyenne County as did his maternal grandparents, who came from Iowa.

Lindsten graduated from Highland Country School, St. Francis High School and Grand Island, Neb., Business College.

On April 26, 1942, he married Rosetta Jensen in Washington D.C. He served in the Navy, returning after his honorable discharge in October of 1945, and moved to Goodland to build a house and start farming.

Later, he was a mechanic and then a manager for Hilty Irrigation in Goodland. He was a member of the St. Paul's Episcopal Church, the Goodland Elks Lodge and the Goodland Masonic Bodies. Lindsten was a founding member of the Goodland Gun Club and served as an officer for many years.

Preceding him in death were his parents and a brother, John Weaver Lindsten.

She attended a country school in south Sherman County and went to high school in Kanorado. She was active in 4-H, where she learned many life-long skills in cooking, sewing and fancy work.

During her school years, her father had many horses, and she acquired a special interest and love for horses.

On July 1, 1946, she married Edgar J. Lengel in Raton, N.M. Soon after they married, the couple moved to the Lengel family farm

and ranch between the Republican and Landsman rivers north of Burlington.

Though a busy wife and mother, Mrs. Lengel was a waitress in the Idalia Cafe during the 1960s and drove trucks during beet harvest for area farmers in the early '70s.

Among Mrs. Lengel's many hobbies, she was especially fond of crocheting, ceramics, basket-weaving and fishing.

Preceding her in death were her parents and her husband, Fred Strittmatter.

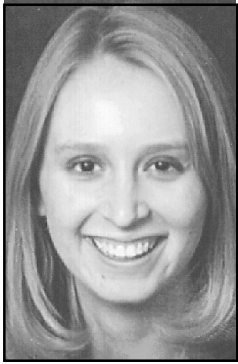

Services were at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the church. Burial followed in Mount Olivet Cemetery.

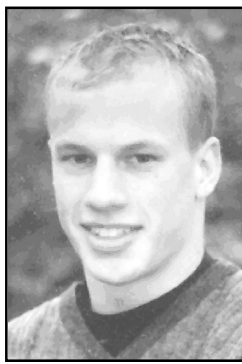
A rosary reading was held at 7 p.m. Thursday at the Mount Olivet Chapel.
