While some males assaulted as boys by older males come to realize that while they don't want to replicate the abusive component of their experience, they do want to explore consensual interactions with males.

Gaining clarity about one's sexuality is much more difficult for sexual assault survivors. Those dealing with survivors often find they may cause "frustration or anger" by not wanting to report their assault, call it assault or change problematic or even destructive be-
