From 1722-1723 Jonathan Edwards, the great preacher of yesteryear, penned 70 resolutions, which he determined would govern the rest of his life.

When you consider that he was only 20 years old when he wrote them, you can see why he turned out to be the greatest theological mind ever produced by America and a key figure in the First Great Awakening.

Some of those resolutions were: Resolved, to live with all my might, while I do live. Resolved, never to do anything out of revenge. Resolved, never to do anything, which I should be afraid to do, if I expected it would not be above an hour, before I should hear the last trump.

Resolved, to study the Scriptures so steadily, constantly and frequently, as that I might find and plainly perceive myself to grow in you!" the knowledge of the same.
