

# Cowboys out shoot Lakin

The Cowboys shook off the overtime loss to Dodge City on Saturday and got back on the winning side Tuesday with a 57-52 win over the Lakin Broncos in Lakin.

The Cowboys raised their season record to 11-6, and are ranked 11th in Class 4A. Tonight the Cowboys are on the road in Oakley for a league matchup, and will host Colby at Max Jones on Tuesday.

Against Lakin the game stayed close through three quarters with the score tied 22-22 at halftime and 40-40 at the end of the third. The Cowboys put on a spurt halfway through the final quarter to win 57-52.

"We just played kind of flat for three quarters," said Coach Jon McLean. "The fourth quarter we played well and that allowed us to get the win."

"The first half we did not shoot the ball well, and we had 11 turnovers. The second half we only had four turnovers and hit some shots."

"Our defense was OK. It allowed us to keep the score close until our offense got on track."

Things started slow for both the Cowboys and the Lakin Broncos in the first quarter, but the Cowboys had a 12-6 lead with under one minute left. The Broncos scored the final two baskets of the quarter to cut it to 12-11.

In the second quarter the Broncos went on a short scoring run to lead 20-14 with under three minutes left.

The Cowboys cut the margin to 2, 22-20 on a basket by Nick Angelos with 45 seconds left in the half. The Broncos missed their next shot and the Cowboys got the rebound and Tanner Smith tied the score at 22 on a pass from Mikey Doll with 14 seconds left. Neither team could get a shot off and the half ended in the 22-22 tie.

Scoring started slowly in the third quarter and the Cowboys got a 24-22 lead with six minutes left.

The Cowboys had a short scoring spurt to lead 36-29 with three minutes left. The Broncos came back to cut the margin to 1, 38-37 with under one minute left.

Nick Angelos passed to Smith who scored to make it 40-37 with 46 seconds left. Andrew Taylor came in to give Smith a break and was called for back-to-back fouls. With 7.4 seconds left Bronc Kaman Schneider hit a basket and was fouled. He made the free throw to tie the game at 40-40.

A final shot by Cowboy Nathan Linin was not good at the buzzer.

Greg Farris started the Cowboy scoring in the fourth with one of his 2 three-point baskets to make it 43-40. The Cowboys put Lakin in the bonus with seven minutes left, and on free throws the Broncos took a 44-

Smith led the Cowboys scoring with 24 points. Wyatt Rice was the top scorer for Lakin with 25 points.

"Tanner has really played well the last two weeks," Coach McLean said. "He has been fun to watch I have been extremely pleased with his improvement, especially keep himself on the floor and not fouling as much. He has just played awfully well."

Doll and Farris were in double figures with 11 and 10 respectively. Nick Angelos had 7 and Travis Angelos 5. Nick Angelos had 6 assists 6 steals and 9 rebounds to lead the Cowboys.

"It was a good team win on a night when we definitely did not play our best," McLean said.

The Cowboys shot 44.7 percent from the floor (21-47) and made 57.9 percent of their free throws (11-19). The Broncos shot 41.3 from the floor (19-46) and 83.3 percent of their free throws (10-12). The Cowboys out rebounded the Broncos 26-23.

"We won every match I thought we should win," said Coach Joseph Sramek. "There were no upsets on our end."

It was a closer dual than the score indicated, he added, because St. Francis had a lot of tough kids. Goodland expected some tough matches, he said, and they got them.

Taylor was sick most of the week, Sramek said, but still won 6-4. Schields wrestled the third-ranked kid in the state, the coach said, and won 7-2.

The Cowboys will face Oakley at 5:30 p.m. tonight at Max Jones Fieldhouse. It will be Senior Night, and the wrestling cheerleaders plan a special dance rou-

tine between the junior varsity and varsity events.

Mason, Tyrel Smith, Schields, Goodley and Binder will be honored, along with cheerleaders Shandel Simon, Nicole David and Candice Meissinger.

To prepare for competition, the Cowboys are doing all they can to stay well, Sramek said, since there has been a lot of sickness going around. The team had nine wrestlers out sick one day last week, the coach said, six another and seven another.

"I want that out of the way before regionals," he said. "I'm keeping the mats extra clean, telling them to get flu shots and take care of their bodies."
