Cowgirls beat Eagles in tough game, 55-50

The Goodland Star-News In a fast moving and physical game, the Cowgirls came from behind to beat the Colby Lady Eagles, 55-50, on Saturday night at Max Jones Fieldhouse, giving the girls back-to-back victories and tying for third in the Northwest Kansas

League. "I was thrilled with the two wins," said Coach Don Smith. "It was almost like a different team and it was fun to be part of that."

The Colby girls had only lost one previous game, also to Goodland, at the Orange and Black Classic in January in Colby. Saturday's game had been postponed from Tuesday because of snow.

In the first two minutes Saturday, Goodland moved out to an 8-0 lead. Colby fought back, bringing the score to 16-15 at the end of a tough, physical quarter.

In the second quarter, the lead seesawed back and forth between Colby and Goodland. In the last 15 seconds, Colby's Lissa Mazanac and April Gee made two two-point shots and the Lady Eagles pulled ahead 28-25.

Colby scored the first basket of the third quarter, at one point widening the score to 33-40. The Cowgirls fought back, though, and ended the period one point ahead,

The fourth quarter featured lots of turnovers, with both coaches off the bench urging their teams on. With 38 seconds left, Goodland led 51-50 and Goodland called a time out.
