Season's highlight league championship

The Goodland Star-News The season ended Saturday for the Cowboys basketball team, with a 63-49 loss to Thomas More Prep-Marian in the substate championship, but the team members can look back on a 16-7 season that included a 7-0 run to win the Northwest Kansas League title.

"These kids had a great year," said Coach Jon McLean on Monday. "We struggled a little around the Orange and Black Classic, but the team bounced back to win 9 of their last 11 games.

"I am real proud of the way they finished the season."

Senior Nick Angelos led the team in scoring with and average of 14.2 points. He hit 60.7 percent of his field goals (136-224) and 57.9 percent of his free throws (55-95). Angelos averaged 9.2 rebounds a game with at total of 211 for the 23 games (71 offensive and 140 defensive). He blocked 28 shots, had 51 steals, 63 assists, and 72 turnovers.

Senior Mikey Doll averaged 13 points per game hitting 25 percent of his three-pointers (48-140), 53.7 percent of his field goals (107-248) and 54.5 percent of his free throws (35-66).

Doll averaged 3.6 rebounds a game with 82 on the season with 10 offensive and 72 defensive. He had 2 blocked shots, 39 steals, 58 assists and 58 turnovers.

Senior Nathan Linin averaged 1.6 points per game. He hit 75 percent of his field goals (15-31) and 58.3 percent of his free throws (7-12). He had 25 rebounds, 6 steals, 22 assists and 26 turnovers.

"Our three seniors are going to be missed," McLean said. "Linin provided this team with excellent lead-

He defeated McCook 67-44 and lost to blocked9 shots, 12 steals, 17 assists and 42 turnovers.

Juniors Josh Doke averaged 1.1 points per game; Preston Dautel.5; Grant Wilkens .3; and Spender 82-48, Garden City 72-64 and St. Windell.5.
