COLBY COMMUNITY COLLEGE COLBY, KANSAS

Shall Colby Community College, Colby, Kansas, issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,490,000, to pay a portion of the estimated \$20,000,000 costs to construct, equip and furnish (a) a Wellness/Activities Complex of approximately 115,000 square feet, which will include a 2,400-seat competition gymnasium, a secondary practice gymnasium with spectator seating, eight locker rooms, an elevated walking track, free weights, machine weights, cardio center, coaches' office, all-purpose classroom, large concession area and a vestibule; (b) a 260-bed dormitory and (c) all other necessary improvements appurtenant thereto, at an estimated cost not to exceed \$20,000,000, by entering into a lease purchase agreement and, if advantageous, issues certificates of participation, with the principal amount of such lease purchase agreement to not exceed \$10,510,000 and the expected total of all payments, including interest, under said lease purchase agreement to be approximately \$15,950,000 (excluding amounts required for maintenance, taxes or insurance on the improvements)? The balance of the project costs shall be paid from grants and contributions the College expects to receive in an amount of \$5,000,000 and the proceeds of general obligation bonds of the College.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL QUESTION ELECTION COLBY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, COLBY, KANSAS

Shall the following be adopted?

That the Governing Body of the Colby Community College shall be authorized to acquire, construct, install and equip (a) a Wellness/Activity Complex of approximately 115,000 square feet, which will include a 2,400-seat competition gymnasium, a secondary practice gymnasium with spectator seating, wrestling room, eight locker rooms, an elevated walking track, free weights, machine weights, cardio center, coaches' office, all-purpose classroom, large concession area and a vestibule; (b) a 260-bed dormitory and (c) all other necessary improvements appurtenant thereto, at an estimated cost not to exceed \$20,000,000, by entering into a lease purchase agreement and, if advantageous, issues certificates of participation, with the principal amount of such lease purchase agreement to not exceed \$10,510,000 and the expected total of all payments, including interest, under said lease purchase agreement to be approximately \$15,950,000 (excluding amounts required for maintenance, taxes or insurance on the improvements)?
