



Artist to sign paintings, talk about work Saturday

Doug Huscher, the featured artist at the Carnegie Arts Center this month, will be at the center from 1 to 4 p.m. Saturday to sign his limited-edition prints and discuss his work.

Huscher, a former Goodland resident and instructor at the Northwest Kansas Technical School, who now lives in Colorado Springs, where he works mostly in oils.

He said he has been painting since the early 1980s. He says he developed his style and techniques to achieve a unique look. Although he is mainly self-taught. The artist said he has attended many work-

shops and classes that influenced his style.

His landscapes hang in private and corporate collections throughout the states he has lived in during his 40-year work career. He has displayed his work in group shows and has won awards over the years.

"Living in Colorado provides ... daily inspiration to view the wondrous colors of nature, coupled with the variations of textures, shapes and moods created by the changing light on the Rocky Mountains landscape," Huscher said. "My desire is to capture these in each landscape I create, utilizing vivid color and tex-

ture. Now that I am retired, I have the time to devote to this passion and sharing my creations with others."

For his show in Goodland, Huscher traveled around northwest Kansas for inspiration.

He has included some familiar landscapes among his paintings on display. Original oil landscape paintings and limited-edition prints will be available during this exhibit.

Center hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 1 to 5 p.m. Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Admission is free.

"Hidden Lake," a mountain view in oils, greets visitors this month to the Carnegie Arts Center. Paintings by Doug Huscher of Colorado Springs include several inspired by the Colorado mountains, California ocean views and western-Kansas homesteads, including one in Sherman County. Randall O. Tupper

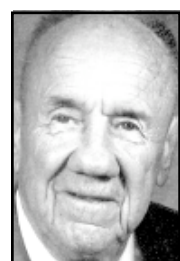
Randall O. Tupper, 78, retired co-owner of the former Goodland Motor Co., died Tuesday, March 13, 2007, at his home.
