It didn't — instead it was quite the opposite. I have never seen a bear in these parts, but I am convinced one jumped on my back about half way through that little scamper down the country road.



> The truth is, for a child of God there is no such thing as an unanswered prayer. Maybe you've heard it said before that God answers prayer in three ways. Sometimes, the answer is "yes." Sometimes, the answer is "wait a while."

> We like the "yes" don't we? What about when God says, "No"?

Let me suggest three principles. First, we need to trust God enough to realize that He is all-loving, all-powerful, loves us and has our best interests at heart. So when it seems that God

Finally, we need to realize that the answer may not be "no" but only 'wait a while."
