

# Athletic testing planned in Hays

Hays Medical Center's High Plains Sports Medicine clinic will hold its fourth annual Kansas Athletic Testing Combine on Saturday, April 21, at the Center for Health Improvement.

Testing will be from 8 a.m. to noon (Mountain Time). There is a charge.

The Kansas Athletic Testing Combine is designed to assess the individual strengths and weaknesses of students in grades seven through 12 to help them reach their highest potential.

Tests performed during this event include height, weight, body composition, seated shot put, pro agil-

ity, vertical jump, standing long jump, 10-yard dash, 40-yard dash and bench press.

High Plains Sports Medicine provides staff and testing equipment, including electronic timers accurate to 1/100th of a second.

Each athlete will receive a T-shirt and an individual athletic profile which includes test results, rankings and an overall athletic rating, allowing athletes to identify specific strengths and weaknesses. Athletic directors and coaches from each school will get similar reports.

# Prune roses before new growth

The best time to prune roses is in the spring before new growth appears and after danger of killing frost.

Be sure to remove dead stubs. Otherwise, canker fungi may invade them and move into healthy tissue during the summer. Use sharp shears and make cuts at a 45-degree angle about a quarter-inch above healthy buds.

How much to prune after removing deadwood depends on the rose type. If you have shrub roses, pruning consists of removing dead wood. For purposes of this article, we will concentrate on hybrid tea roses. With hybrid teas, there are three pruning styles, each with a specific purpose.

Heavy or severe pruning is done on well-established, vigorous plants to produce large, showy flowers. Prune back to three to four healthy canes with three to six eyes per cane. Canes normally will be six to 12 inches long.

Moderate pruning on well-established, healthy plants is designed to increase the number of flowers produced rather than the size. Leave five to six healthy canes with at least

seven buds per cane. Prune stems to 12 to 18 inches. Light pruning rejuvenates plants after years of neglect or may be performed on newly established plants. Leave five to seven canes of about 18 inches or more in length. This helps maximize leaf area for energy production and rejuvenates plants.

If plants suffered significant winter damage, they may need to be cut back more severely. This will result in a few large flowers but, in this case, is the only option you have.

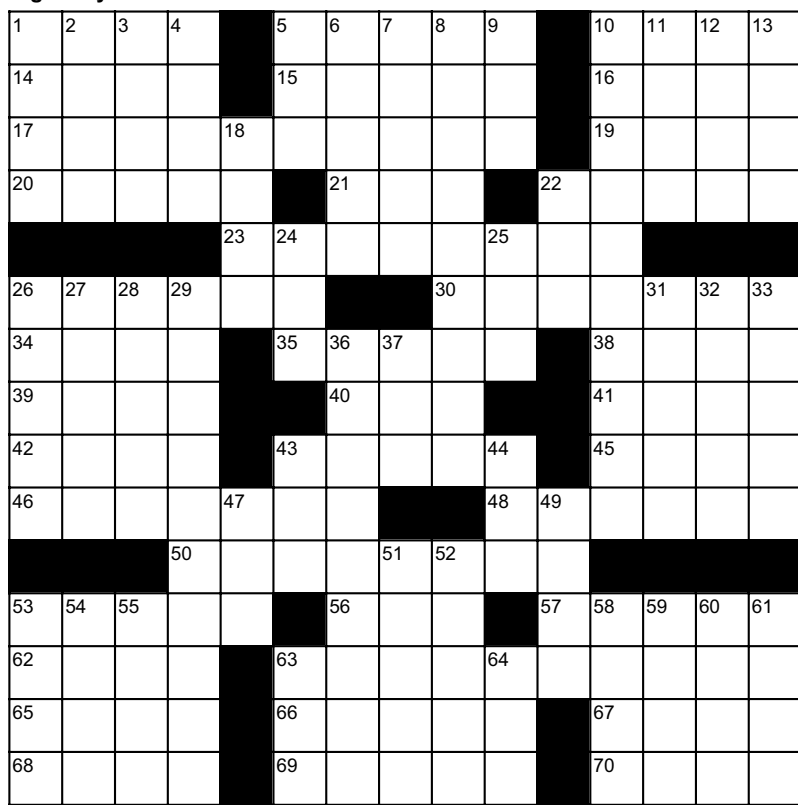
