Bird City jumper qualifies for nationals

Bird City native Amanda Poore cleared 5 feet, 9.25 inches to win the 5,000-meter run, finishing 11th high jump at the Alex Francis Classic on March 30 and April 1 at Fort Hays State University.

Poore was one of five women from Fort Hays to meet the national qualifying mark in their events as the Lady Tigers won 12 of 19 events to earn the women's title.

Poore, a 2003 graduate of Cheylin High, cleared the same height last month to finish second at the NCAA Division II indoor track and field championships in Boston.

Former Goodland Cowgirl Tiffany Thomas, a freshman at Colby

Community College, competed in the 5,000-meter run, finishing 11th overall in 22 minutes, 23.01 seconds. The Lady Trojans finished fifth among the eight teams at the classic.

The distance running events were held March 30 while the weather delayed the rest of the events 24 hours to April 1.

Fort Hays State also took the men's team title, winning 10 events with three Tigers meeting national qualifying marks.

The next meet for both the Fort Hays men and the women will be the NCAA Division II Challenge on Friday and Saturday at Emporia State University.
