She was born Jan. 6. 1922. in Nora, Neb., the daughter of Clarence and Vivian (Jones) Reade. She grew up and attended school in Bird City and attended Hastings College in Hastings, Neb.

On June 4, 1944, she married J. Memorials may be made to the Lloyd Troutt in Bird City. His Bogue Hightower Park Project or first wife had died, leaving him with children, so she began the marriage cooking for a family of five.

They lived on a farm near Brewster, which they later sold and moved to Goodland. She worked at the ASCS office, and he worked for the city.

Their paths hadn't crossed in 40 years, but she sent a letter to him in Phillipsburg after she heard his wife died. Then, they decided to meet at a Berry reunion in Goodland.
