

Goodland wins doubleheader

The Goodland Elks K-18 baseball team continued its winning streak by beating Oakley in a doubleheader on Monday at Memorial Field, 20-8 and 16-3. Their record is 4-2 for the season.

In the first game, Goodland had to come back twice to take the lead, but nine runs in the third and six in the fourth gave them a 20-8 win over Oakley. Oakley took an early lead in the second game, but Goodland came back to take a 7-3 lead at the end of the second inning. Goodland scored four in the third and five in the fourth to win 16-3 in five innings.

Kyle Zerr was the first batter for Oakley in the top of the first inning. He hit a single, stole second and was batted in. Levi Hefner struck out. Micky Stewart hit a double, went to third and scored on an error by the center fielder. He also earned an RBI. The score was Oakley, 2-0.

Right fielder David Murray was first to bat for Goodland and he walked to first, advanced to second from a sacrifice bunt by Michael Pettibone, stole third and scored on a wild pitch. Reed Bellamy walked, advanced to second and third by an error of the catcher and scored. Devon Garrett walked, stole second and third and scored on an error of the pitcher. Garth Helton walked,

advanced to second and third and scored on a wild pitch. The score was Goodland, 4-2.

In the top of the second inning the first two batters were out for Oakley. Zerr hit a single and went to second by an error of the second baseman and was batted in when Hefner hit a single. Hefner stole second and was batted in on a single by Mikey Stewart. He scored along with Cody Stewart and Tad Parsons. The score was Oakley, 7-4.

Pettibone scored the only run for Goodland in the bottom of the second making the score Oakley, 7-5.

Oakley did not score in the top of the third. Helton was the first out on a fly to left field. Dallas DeLaRosa and Brook Redlin hit a single and eventually scored. Dillon Trachsel and David Murray walked to first, advanced and were batted in. Pettibone was hit by a pitch, went to first, advanced and was batted in by Hillmer. Hillmer earned two RBI's. Bellamy walked to first, stole second and was batted in by Garrett on a single. Helton hit a single. Redlin earned two RBI's. The score was Goodland 14-7.

Stewart hit a single, stole second and was batted in by Jeff Albers in the top of the fourth. That was the last run made by Oakley. Goodland had runs by Murray, Pettibone, Bellamy, Garrett, Helton and DeLaRosa. Garrett earned two
