# Swim club wins nine gold medals

The Goodland Swim Club brought home nine individual gold medals from a swim meet in Oberlin on Saturday, with the 8-and-under mixed 120-yard freestyle and 120-yard medley relay teams also taking first.

The team placed third out of nine at the event.

Individual winners included: Taneille Witman (13-14 girls) with three golds. She broke the pool record in the 90-yard breaststroke with a time of 1:10.00 and won the 90-yard and 60-yard freestyle races (56.75 and 34.44).

Riley Oharah (13-14 boys) won two golds for the 60-yard and the 90-yard freestyle races (33.78 and 1:16.90).

Other individual event winners were Sianna Miller (8-and-under girls) in the 30-yard backstroke (29.31), Gerell Miller (9-10 boys) 90-yard freestyle (1:18.94), Holton Witman (11-12 boys) 60-yard butterfly (53.38) and Brennan Clouse (15-18 boys) 90-yard freestyle (54.26).

The 120-yard freestyle relay team and 120-yard medley relay won with the times of 2:07.05 and 2:47.87. Members are Alex Goodwin, Hagan Hoss, Dusty Johnson

# Coach to hold football camps

Goodland High School's head football coach plans to offer summer football camps for grade school and junior high students next month.

Coach Jonathan Dansel said he will be holding camps in two sessions from Monday, July 23 to Friday, 27.

Camp for fifth and sixth graders will be from 9:30 a.m. to noon on Thursday and Friday, July 26 and 27, at the high school practice field east of the Northwest Kansas Technical College campus.

Dansel said the non contact camp will focus on fundamentals and special-teams play. Participants should wear shorts, T-shirt and football cleats.

Junior high football camp will be from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, July 23 to 25. All junior high kids planning on going out for football this fall are encouraged to attend.

Dansel said the camps will give players a head start on fall practice by learning the fundamentals.

He said junior high players should register as soon as possible so T-shirts can be ordered. For questions, or to register, call Dansel at

Coach John Hendrich said he encourages all fifth and sixth graders interested in playing Young Guns Football this fall to attend the camp. He said Young Guns will offer tackle football this fall for fifth and sixth graders.

He said the Young Guns will be a traveling team, and the season will mirror the high school season. Hendrich said there will be a meeting for parents in the first part of July, after the wheat harvest. Players must have a physical.

Hendrich said Coach Dansel helped a lot with the Young Guns' first season last year with the offensive playbook and will be working with the special teams this year.

The fifth-grade Young Guns football team finished with a 5-4 record, and defeated Great Bend 15-13 in October to take third place in the Western Kansas Football League tournament. The sixth grade team was 1-5.

Hendrich said he and Terry Taylor will coach the sixth grade, but need some help with the fifth-grade team. He said parents interested in helping coach either team can call him at 821-2211.
