She said the business grants go to the Goodland Grind and Gallery at 1530 Main to help put in a courtyard-style patio on the north side of the coffeehouse, and for awnings in front of Pioneer Health at 910 Main. The businesses will be matching the \$1,500 economic development grants with a total of \$5,500.

McMinn said when the projects are completed and documented, the project grants will be paid out.

"I think with the high volume of applicants we look at doing another round of grants later this year," she added.

Two other projects have been in the development stages, McMinn said, and both are ready to move onto the next level.

A "We Have Jobs" center in the development office is ready to run, she said. Computers are linked to other job sites so people can search for jobs both here and outside the area.

She said the Workforce Center had a \$3,000 budget, but so far about \$300 has been spent. She said the computers were donated and S&T Communications helped get them installed and setup.

Council member Nancy Cole of

Klip 'n Kurl asked if the job listings are on the council's web site.

McMinn said the listing is available at www.gogoodlandks.com. By clicking on "jobs," people see involved in the meetings to give the jobs listed and businesses can add and delete listings online. She said the next step is to advertise to let business people and those looking for jobs know the service is available.

She said besides looking for jobs, people can use the center to do some research about employment and develop a resume.

McMinn said the other project she would like to see move forward is to set up meetings with the homebased businesses and then continue on to Main Street, Business U.S. 24 and K-27.

Council Chairman Don Newell said he thought it was a great idea to get home-based businesses involved, and they could encourage people who have home-based businesses to expand and possibly open Main Street locations.

"We want these people to know what economic development can passed.
