Goodale said the tractors were evidently taken before the snows in December because there were no tracks on the ground, but he hadn't been out to check them over the winter.

In Wallace County, the men were charged with theft of a 1973 International 1066 tractor owned by Orie Ritter of Sharon Springs. Stephens said in his plea he stole the tractor March 10.

Callicrate appeared before Judge John Cahoj Tuesday in the Sherman County District Court and waived his right to a preliminary hearing. His arraignment is scheduled for Monday, Sept. 10. In the meantime, his attorney, Michael Day, and Sherman County Attorney Bonnie Selby are trying to work out a plea agreement.


