Goodland couple's son to coach

Two Goodland High School students will attend the 24th annual Kansas Masonic All-State High School Marching Band Camp at 7:45 p.m. this week and perform at the Shrine Bowl on Saturday in Hays.

A Goodland couple's son will coach the West team and several area students will take part as musicians or on the field.

Devin Mangus, trumpet, and Tanner Oharrah, trombone, will attend a five-day band camp starting today at Fort Hays State University. The band, featuring top high school musicians from across the state, will march in a parade at 9 a.m. (Mountain Time) Saturday in downtown Hays and play at the game Saturday night.

Jason Kenny, Ulysses High School coach, and son of Dale and Sharon Kenny of Goodland, will coach the West team. His father is a manager at Century Feeders and his mother works at the Northwest Kansas Technical College.

Levi Weeden of St. Francis Community High School will play for the West team.

The pregame show will begin at 5:30 p.m. (Mountain Time) and kick off will be at 6 p.m. at Fort Hays State University's Lewis Field Stadium.

Parking lots open at 3 p.m. Ticket can be bought in advance by calling (800) 530-5524 or at the door for \$1 more. Reserved seat (chair back seats between the 30 yard lines) are extra. The game will be broadcast on Smoky Hills Public Television.

The band will perform before the game and at half-time, which is estimated to start

The 214 students in the band will be directed by Gary Brattin and his Fort Hays State University band staff. Other students from the area attending band camp include Courtney Ress, clarinet, from Colby High School, and Cara Hunt, piccolos/flutes, Corbin Sherlock, trumpets, and Taylor Spike, trombone, all of St. Francis.

More than 4,000 young people have performed in the Kansas Masonic All-State High School Marching Band since 1984.


The marching band is a project of the Kansas Masonic Foundation, and the cost for each student is paid by local lodges and other affiliated bodies in their home towns. Money left from band camp after expenses is donated to the Kansas Masonic Cancer Research Institute at the University of Kansas Medical Center in Kansas City. Net proceeds from the Shrine Bowl game are donated to the Shriner's Hospitals for Children.
