OPPORTUNITY FOR WORK

The City of Kanorado has received a \$400,000 Community Development Block Grant from the Kansas Department of Commerce for supply and distribution system improvements including the replacement of all 2 inch and 4 inch water lines and wells within the municipal system, replacement of all services along these lines, and 16 fire hydrants.

This grant will provide the City of Kanorado the opportunity to search for eligible local citizens interested in participating in the project. Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended through 1994, provides that to the great-

est extent feasible, preference for economic opportunities will be given to citizens in Sherman County who are determined to be low- to moderate- income individuals. A low- to moderateincome individual can be calculated by documenting household income of less than 80 percent of the county median income. Opportunities such as job training and employment that arise through this Community Development Block Grant project will be directed toward County residents. Contractors can be eligible for Section 3 contract as awarded in connection with CDBG projects if they meet one of the following definitions:
