Iola Leone (Kemp) Wray, 89, Goodland, a farm wife and former writer for *The Bird City Times*, died Saturday, July 21, 2007, at the Good Samaritan Society — Sherman County.

She was born July 17, 1918, at the family farm south of Bird City, the daughter of James LeRoy and Lucy (Allen) Kemp. Because of her small size, her parents laid her in the oven to keep her warm.

Growing up, she loved to play house in the cob and coal bins with her sisters. She attended grade school and high school in Bird City and graduated in 1936.

She was baptized in Beaver Creek and became a member of the Assembly of God Church, serving as a Sunday school teacher and president of women's ministries for several years.

She met her future husband in

the youth group and married Clyde Hamilton Wray on Sept. 25, 1937, at Traer. They attended the Central Bible Institute in Enid, Okla.

They farmed for a short time in Cheyenne County after living in North Platte, Neb., where he worked for a Caterpillar dealer. She enjoyed writing for the newspaper and worked at the Good Samaritan Village in St. Francis.

One of her greatest delights was getting together with her three sisters. Mrs. Wray flew her American flag high and encouraged her family to vote in every election. She often wrote to senators and congressmen.

She lived in the home her husband built until January, when her declining health forced her to move to the nursing home.
