Leonard Gordon Blume, 88, Red Bluff, Calif., brother of Dean (Erna) Blume of Goodland, died Tuesday, July 31, 2007, in Red Bluff.

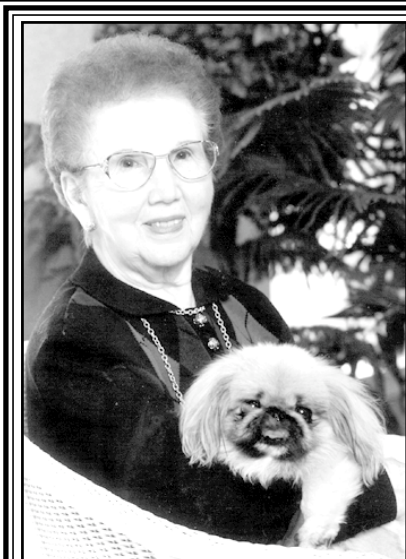
