

Housing rehab application moving ahead

The city commission held a public hearing Monday on a \$400,000 housing rehabilitation grant that the Sherman County Economic Development Council and the Northwest Kansas Planning and Development Commission have been preparing.

Amy Griffey from the planning commission and Helen Dobbs of the development council came to talk about the application. The grant would help rehabilitate homes in a target area west of Main Avenue in southwest Goodland.

When Mayor Billinger opened the hearing and asked for any comments, no one spoke for or against the grant application.

Billinger asked Dobbs if she had any questions, and she said she did not. She said she had been working on the target area and had sent letters to all the property owners and tenants in the area about the hearing.

The target area is between 15th Street and 17th Street, from a half block west of Main west to Mon-

Griffey said so far, all the pieces are coming together for the application, which has to be submitted by

the end of the month. After the hearing, Griffey ask the commission to designate an inspector for the grant project. She said only one firm submitted a bid, and
