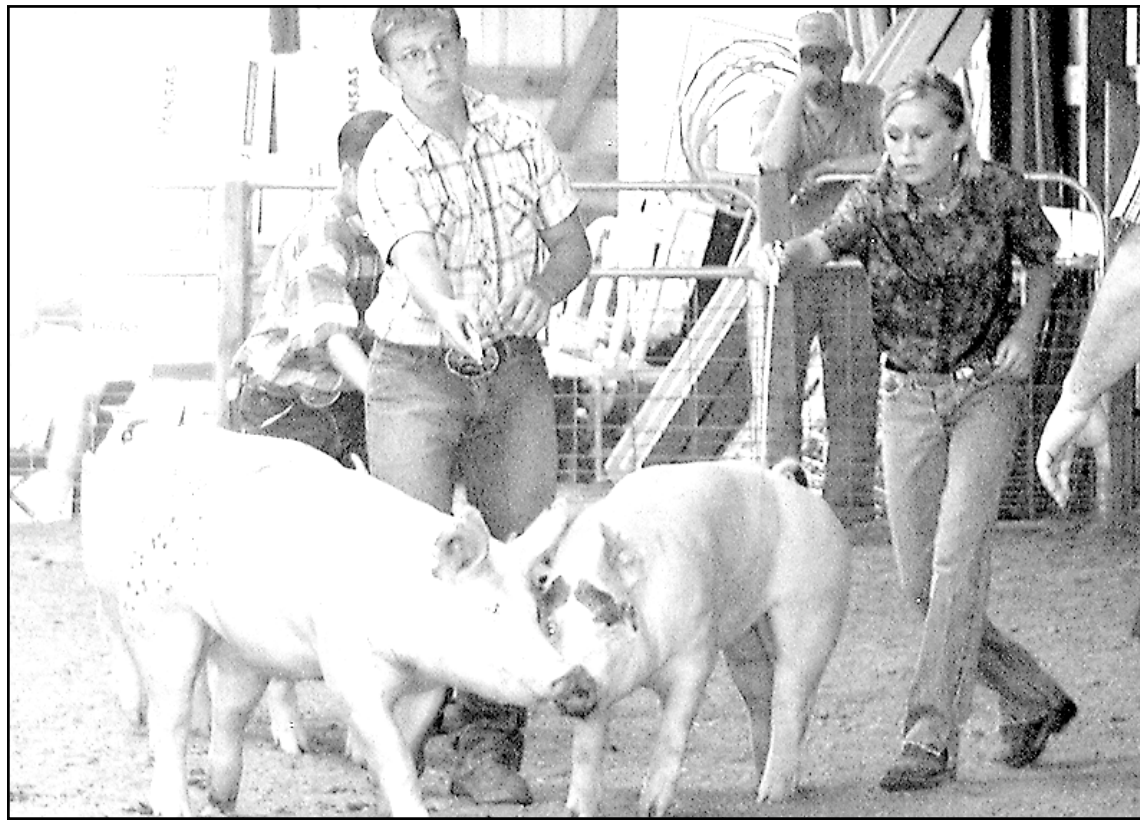

# Housing rehab application moving ahead

The city commission held a public hearing Monday on a \$400,000 housing rehabilitation grant that the Sherman County Economic Development Council and the Northwest Kansas Planning and Development Commission have been preparing.

Amy Griffey from the planning commission and Helen Dobbs of the development council came to talk about the application. The grant would help rehabilitate homes in a target area west of Main Avenue in southwest Goodland.

When Mayor Billinger opened the hearing and asked for any comments, no one spoke for or against the grant application.

Billinger asked Dobbs if she had any questions, and she said she did not. She said she had been working on the target area and had sent letters to all the property owners and tenants in the area about the hearing.

The target area is between 15th Street and 17th Street, from a half block west of Main west to Montana Avenue.

Griffey said so far, all the pieces are coming together for the application, which has to be submitted by the end of the month.

After the hearing, Griffey ask the commission to designate an inspector for the grant project. She said only one firm submitted a bid, and the grant will pay for the inspections.

Commissioner Josh Dechant asked how much that would cost. Griffey said that would depend on the number of houses handled in the grant. Hill said the contract calls for payments of \$440 for each house inspected.

## City pledges support for Flatlander Festival

The Goodland City Commission pledged the city to help organizers of the annual Flatlander Fall Festival after they came in with a series of requests and an update on the September event on Monday.

Lincoln Wilson, chairman of the Flatlander committee and owner of the Howard Johnson Hotel, asked the commission to provide several things for the festival, which will be Sept. 28 to 30:

- Permission to block off Main from Eighth to 17th on Saturday, Sept. 29, for the car show, motorcycle show and festival booths.
- Permission to use Chambers Park again this year on Sunday for a Picnic in the Park.
- A permit for a beer garden on Main to be the same location as last year.
- Use of the city's barricades.
- To rent the electrical poles on Main for \$250, the same price as last year.
- The city to provide two additional 220-volt outlets at 11th and Main. He said there are two at that corner now, but the committee is asking that be upgraded to four.
- Use of the city picnic tables, benches and bleachers on Saturday, and help to move them from Main to Chambers Park for the Sunday event.

The commission approved all the requests.

Wilson said the committee has about the same amount of booth sales as at this time last year, but expects a slight increase. He said the committee is doing a sponsored poster to raise money, and that so far they have covered the cost and hope to add to that before it goes to print.

The Flatlander Festival Golf Tournament will be held on Friday, he said, and Debbie Reed is handling the details. He said they are asking people to sponsor teams for a three-person scramble.

Committee members Bill Stocik, owner of Motel 6, and Brent Wood from AIG Financial, were with Wilson at the meeting.

"Everything worked pretty great last year," said Mayor Rick Billinger.

"It worked great," Wilson said. "I would have been nice to have warmer weather, but the Picnic in the Park on Sunday was a great day. It was good to see the number of people who came and enjoyed the afternoon."

Griffey said that is correct, but not every house would have to be inspected. She said any house selected for demolition would have to be inspected for asbestos, but most remodeling projects would not.

She said the Northwest Central Regional Planning Commission of Beloit was the only bidder. She said the commission is similar to the her agency, and the inspector is home based in Hays.

"The fee comes out of the grant itself?" Dechant asked.

"Yes there will be money for administration and inspections," Griffey said. "They will charge the max or close to it allowed under the grant. The city will not be putting money into the grant."

"We will try to use all \$400,000 without any money from the city." The commission approved the inspection contract.

Griffey said she would work with Dobbs and Tiffani McMinn, economic development director, who is on leave in Texas with her mother who is recuperating from back surgery, to get the grant application ready.
