> A new Kansas law may allow you to exempt Social Security benefits from your state income taxes. If you are eligible, you will be able to subtract Social Security benefits that are included in your federal adjusted gross income when you file your Kansas income tax return.

> Social Security benefits can be subtracted to obtain Kansas taxable income only if your federal adjusted gross income falls below certain levels. Check into this with your tax




