

Cowgirl finishes seventh

The Goodland High School cross country team, starting the season at its home meet Thursday, had the seventh-place finisher in the junior and senior girls race.

Goodland didn't post team scores for boys or girls but had some outstanding finishes, including junior Brittaney Medrano taking seventh in the junior and senior girls' race. She finished the 4,000 meters in 19.13 minutes.

Goodland's top runner in the freshman and sophomore boys race was Steven Buller, finishing the 5,000 meters in 22.28 minutes, 18th out of 42 runners.

Medrano and Buller were the teams' standouts by far, said Coach Richard Schwasinger. Medrano was in second place early in the race, he said, and got into trouble on the hills. She had a knee injury in the fifth grade, he said, and struggles every year.

Junior Cassie Cooper finished in 23.27 minutes, 23rd out of 27 runners, and junior Savannah Schlink was 25th in 23.55. Goodland didn't have a runner in the freshman and sophomore girls race, as freshman Kaitlyn Lammers just joined the team and hadn't practiced enough to compete.

Goodland's top runner in the junior and senior boys race was junior Dallas Price, finishing in 25.55 minutes for 36th out of 44 runners. Senior Chris Geeseka was 39th in 27.53, junior Justin Verlinden was 40th in 28.19 and junior Bryan Gray didn't finish due to an ankle injury. Geeseka had a good race, Schwasinger said.

Also in the freshman and sophomore boys race were freshmen Michael Pettibone, finishing in 23.16 minutes for 23rd out of 42 runners, and Talison Crosby in 24.03 for 29th.

The top team scores for boys went to Ogallala, Neb., first, Scott City, second, and Chase County, Neb., third. Fourth through eighth were Perkins County, Neb., Colby,

Quinter, Lakin and Ulysses.

Ulysses' girls were first, Colby was second and Chase County third. Fourth through sixth were Perkins County, Lakin and Ogallala.

Goodland was short a few runners. Senior Dustin Pennington just joined the team and hadn't practiced enough yet. Sophomore Ben Waugh is out for two weeks, and AFS exchange student Martin Stadelmann was out with a knee injury.

The doctor said to keep Waugh out two weeks, Schwasinger said, but he doesn't know what's wrong for sure.

Gray had ankle problems in tennis last year that weren't taken care of, the coach said, adding he doesn't think it's anything serious.

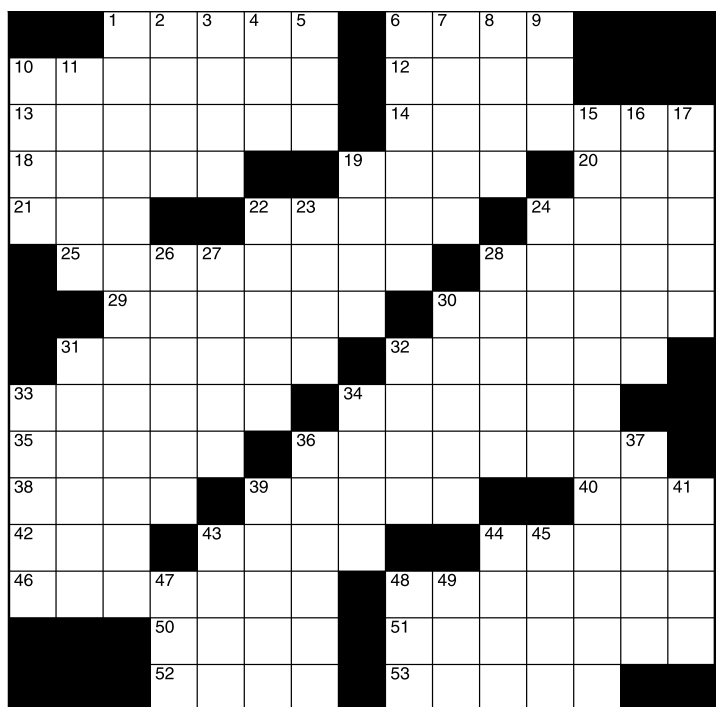
If Gray had finished, Schwasinger said, the boys could have had a team score.

Some of Goodland's runners will go to the state fair, Schwasinger said, but there will still be a good team at the meet.

"We'll be in the group at Tribune," he said.

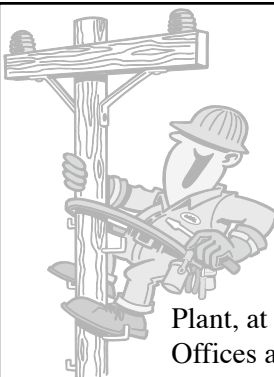

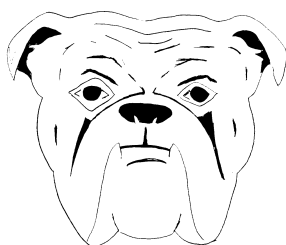
