The team put together a couple of decent drives later in the game but saw their only touchdown called back on a penalty for having 12 men on the field. Another drive ended on a failed fourth-down conversion.

The game kicked off with a bang as senior wide receiver Tanner Smith ran back the opening kickoff 79 yards for a touchdown. The extra point try was no good, and the score stood at 6-0. It would be Goodland's only lead of the night. The Indians answered with a latefirst-quarter touchdown by sophomore running back Trent Raile. Senior quarterback Ted Crabtree took the ball over the line for two points

to give the Indians their first lead. Shade covered the field as the second quarter got under way. St. Francis pulled ahead of the Cowboys 14-6 on another touchdown run by Raile.

Junior quarterback Travis Angelos came out swinging on the next Cowboy possession. A deep pass to sophomore wide receiver Brandon Rome set up a first and goal at the two-yard line. The Cowboys first two attempts failed to produce any points but set up a third down on the two-foot mark. The next play was an incomplete pass off the hands of senior fullback T.J. Hawkins.

On fourth and goal, the play was a run up the middle to Hawkins. The Cowboys scored, the music blaring, and the Goodland fans went crazy. Then a late yellow flag flew near the Head Referee. To the dismay of the Cowboys, the penalty was for too many men on the field. The team was stripped of the touchdown and forced to attempt a 34-yard field goal. The kick was short, and the Indians took over.

As night fell, the stadium lights kicked on and the second half kicked off. The Indians took the kick and scored on their first possession with a 44-yard romp from senior running back David Guthmiller. Raile ran in the twopoint conversion to make the score 22-6.

Toward the end of the third quarter, the Cowboys were putting together another comeback. With some incredible runs by junior running back, Fernando Martinez, the boys found themselves on the Indians side of the field looking to score. The Cowboys ended the third quarter with a fourth and one deep in need to go out next week and keep Indian territory. The stadium filled with suspense as the teams traded ends of the field road at 6 p.m. (Mountain Time) on and the Cowboys looked to keep the Friday.
