

Season champions honored at final race

The last regular racing night at the Sherman County Speedway on Saturday saw some new winners and the naming of the season champions in the Mini-stock, Bomber, Stock, Econo and Modified classes.

One more weekend of racing is on the schedule on Sept. 28 and 29 for the Flatlander Fall Festival Classic.

Track champions, based on the season point sheet, were:

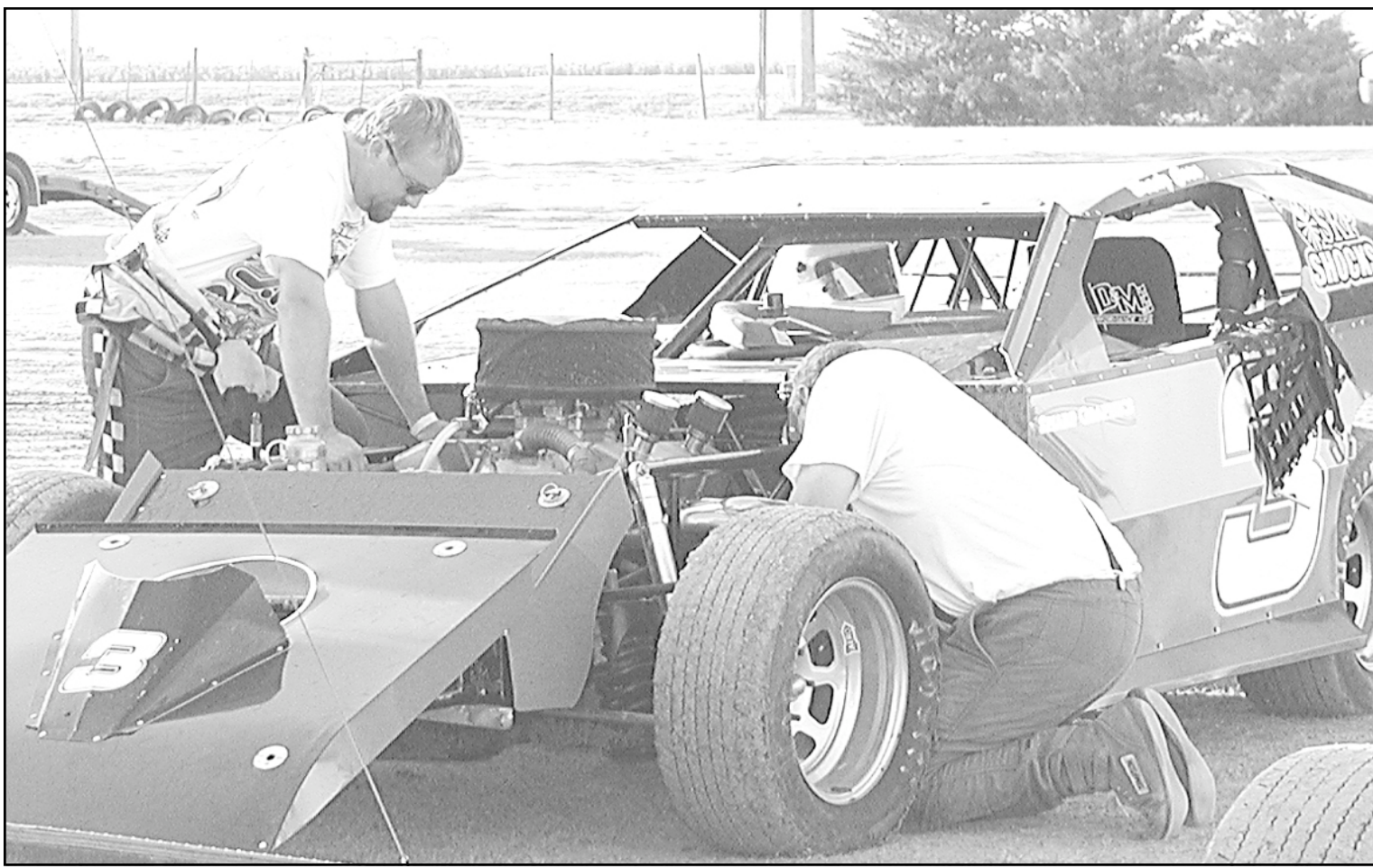
- Tyrell Smith (12) of Goodland in the Mini-stock class.
- Roger Snethen (S5) of Goodland in the Econo class.
- Joey Snethen (S98) of Goodland in the Bomber class.
- Angel Munoz (95N) of Lamar, Colo., in the Stock class.
- Darren DeLoach (21) of Lamar in the Modified class.

Dalton Dolan (3D) of Oberlin won the Mini-stock main race on Saturday in his mini pickup, beating out class champion Smith for the checkered flag. Cory Navarro (6), who had won the main at the Bill Gray Memorial on Aug. 18, was third.

Smith won the track title in the Mini-stock class with 270 points, ahead of Josh Frecks (5) of Stratton, Colo., with 230.

Matt Morris (21M) of Lamar won the Bomber main ahead of Raymond Dechant (00) of Lamar. Adam Morris (27) of Lamar was third and Steve Arntt (12) of Goodland was fourth.

Joey Snethen (S98), who finished sixth in the main, won the track title with 264 points, narrowly edging Dechant at 254. Adam Morris was third with 247, Matt Morris (21M) fourth with 242 and Brian Morris (8) fifth. All three are from Lamar.

Goodland's Steve Arntt (12) finished in sixth with 165 points.

Lee Hageman (4) of Goodland won the Econo main and finished a close second to Roger Snethen (S5) in the season points race. Snethen had 299 points to lead the class with Hageman second with 284.

Drew Miller (49) was second in the main race with Chad

Normandin (01) third and J.R. Wolfrum (11) fourth; all are from Goodland.

Brady Coen (3) of Wiley, Colo., won the Modified main ahead of Kevin Wark (8) and Jeff Tubbs (37), both of Colby.

This was the second race of the season that Modified track champion Darren DeLoach (21) did not

win. DeLoach was not the winner of the opening race back in May; he appeared to be having some car trouble on Saturday. DeLoach, who has won the Modified title for five years running, had 267 points. Chris Remetes (10) of Denver was second with 260, and Tubbs was third at 233.

Angel Munoz (95N) of Lamar

won the Stock track title, but it was a short season with not enough stock cars to field races for the past three meets. Munoz led the field with 165 points.

The Flatlander Fall Classic will feature races on Friday, Sept. 28, and Saturday, Sept. 29. Action will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Friday and 5:30 p.m. on Saturday.

Weskan graduate leads Bethel rushing attack

Weskan's Beau Cox led the Bethel College rushing attack as the Threshers defeated Kansas Wesleyan University 13-8 in the 2007 Alltel Coyote Kickoff Classic on Saturday in Salina.

Cox ran the ball 26 times for 80 yards. Bethel outgained the Coyotes on the ground 184 yards to 55.

Cox, a 2005 Weskan High graduate, was last year's Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year.

After a scoreless first quarter, Bethel got on the scoreboard first, posting a touchdown to cap a nine-play, 79-yard drive. The Threshers added a 41-yard field goal with five seconds left in the second quarter for a 10-0 halftime lead.

Neither team scored in the third period. Bethel added another field goal, a 21-yarder, with about six minutes left on the clock for a 13-0 lead.

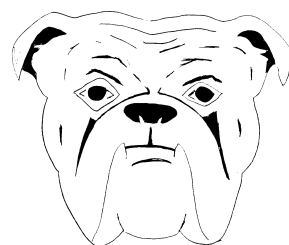

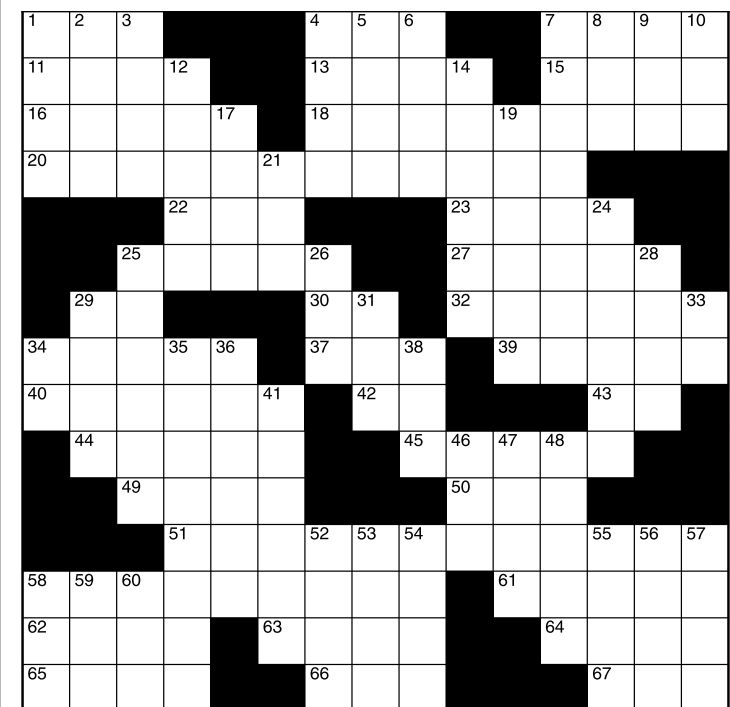
