

Tennis team gets silver in doubles

The Cowgirls tennis team won the silver medal in No. 1 doubles and finished sixth as a team at their home tournament Tuesday.

Eight teams participated in the eighth annual Goodland Varsity Tennis Invitational, said Coach Wallace Hansen.

Goodland finished sixth with 16 points. Colby won with 35, followed by Tribune with 24, WaKeeney and Ulysses with 20 and Scott City with 17.

In the No. 1 doubles, the Goodland High team of Kaitlin Fugleberg and Shonna Webster won the silver. They beat Walz and Ramsey of Garden City 6-0, Myers and Crittenden of Tribune 7-6 (7-1) and Shore and Horton of Ulysses 6-2.

They narrowly lost to Wilson and Caitlin Wark of Colby 7-5 for the gold medal. The WaKeeney duo of Augustine and Diec lost to the Tribune doubles pair for the bronze.

In No. 1 singles, Kathy Wood of Goodland finished sixth.

She beat girls from Garden City and lost to Ulysses, Tribune and Norton girls. Logan Wark of Colby won the gold, beating Morgan Schmidt of Tribune 6-1. Schmidt took the silver, and Olivia Fabrizius of WaKeeney won third over Niki

Eveleigh of Ulysses 6-1.

In No. 2 singles, Sandra Redlin of Goodland finished sixth. She beat Greeson of Tribune 6-2. Her losses were to Coulter of Garden City, Buxman of Ulysses 6-2 and to Huck of Scott City 6-2.

Barbara Bickner of Colby won over Buxman of Ulysses 6-3 for the gold medal. Cassie Dietz of WaKeeney finished third by beating Coulter of Garden City.

In No. 2 doubles, Hidee Lawson and Nicolette Wallis took the court for Goodland. The Colby duo of Dougherty and Hockersmith won over Wendt and Moritz of Tribune by a score of 6-2. Winning third place was the Scott City doubles team of Chambless and Wright, beating Damian and Sterling of Garden City 6-1.

The meet was from 2 to 9 p.m. with almost perfect weather, Hansen said.

"I want to thank the City of Goodland for furnishing the lights and helping the school district with the courts and surroundings," he said.

Next action for the Cowgirls will be at noon Monday at the Scott City Invitational Tournament. On Tuesday, Goodland will have a six-team junior varsity tournament beginning at 3 p.m.

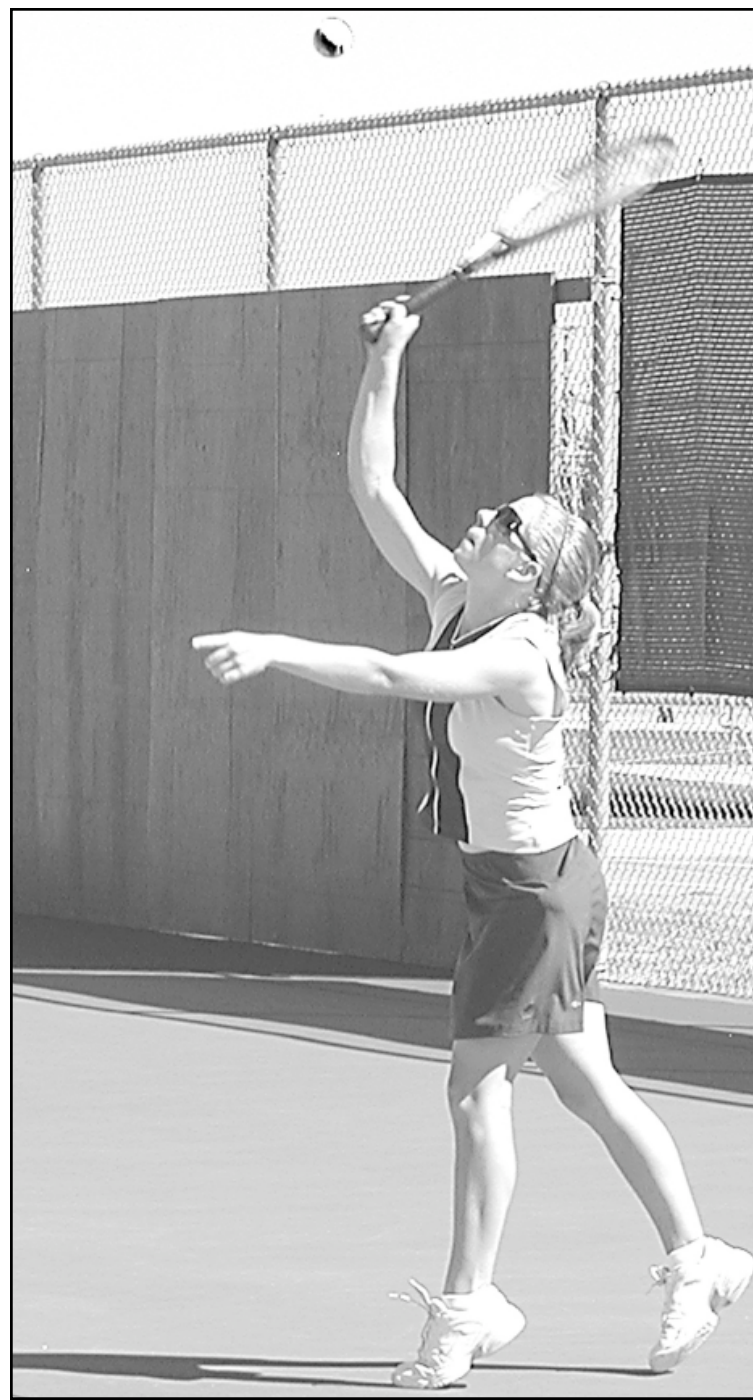

Junior Cowboys beat Colby Eagles at home

The Junior Cowboys fifth- and sixth-grade football teams opened their season at Cowboys Stadium on Saturday, winning both games against the Colby Junior Eagles.

Sixth grade

The sixth grade beat the Colby Eagles 40-0. First-year coach Mike Ruhs said the boys were ready to play the Eagles after losing to them last year.

The Cowboys received the opening kickoff and moved the ball 47 yards in only nine plays.

In their second possession, the Cowboys turned the ball over on downs. They intercepted on the Eagles next play, running it to the 1-yard line. With only one play and one yard to go, the Cowboys were on the board again with a 14-0 lead.

Ruhs said the offensive line did a great job blocking. The Cowboys on the next three possessions moved the ball for 126 yards on 14 plays for three more scores.

The defense also played well, Ruhs said, recovering a fumble and picking off two interceptions. The line put pressure on the Eagles'

quarterback the entire game, and the defense held the Eagles to only two first downs for the day.

The special team also did well, he said, scoring a touchdown on a punt return.

"The kids played very well and were having fun," Ruhs said.

The sixth grade will be at Cowboys Stadium at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday facing Atwood.

Fifth grade

The fifth-grade Junior Cowboys opened their season on Saturday defeating Colby 6-0 at Cowboys Stadium.

The game was scoreless through three quarters, then on the first play of the fourth quarter, Kolt Trachsel ran 37 yards for a touchdown.

Coach Cleve Trachsel said he was proud of the effort the boys showed and felt the team handled themselves well.

The fifth grade will be in action at 10 a.m. Saturday against Norton at Cowboys Stadium.

The coaches said they and the kids appreciate people coming out and supporting the program.

Kaitlin Fugleberg served well against Walz and Ramsey of Garden City at Goodland's home meet Tuesday, and she and her doubles partner Shonna Webster won the match 6-0. The Goodland girls won the silver medal in No. 1 doubles, also beating Myers and Crittenden of Tribune 7-6 (7-1) and Shore and Horton of Ulysses 6-2. They lost to Wilson and Caitlin Wark of Colby, just missing the gold medal.

The Goodland Cowgirls varsity volleyball team finished with a 1-3 record Saturday at the Machebeuf High School tournament in Denver.

The girls won a match against Clear Creek High, 25-19 and 25-15. The team lost to Evergreen 25-19, 14-15 and 15-6; Machebeuf, 25-11 and 25-13; and Summit County 25-16 and 25-17.

"They (the team) improved from the following Tuesday," said coach Jerry McKee. "We saw some really good teams, but played with them

for the most part.

"We struggled with the time between matches and then being ready to fire back up. How to conserve your energy and prepare yourself for later matches will become important items to deal with in practice."

The junior varsity played at a tournament in Leoti on Saturday, finishing fourth.

The Cowgirls beat Colby, 25-22, 23-25 and 15-13 and Leoti, 25-21, 15-25 and 15-5. The team lost to Garden City, 26-24 and 30-28 and Leoti, 24-16 and 28-10.

"They won their pool and then lost a tough match to get into the championship with Garden City," said Coach McKee.

The next action for the varsity, junior varsity and C team will be at 3 p.m. Thursday at a quad meet in Ulysses.

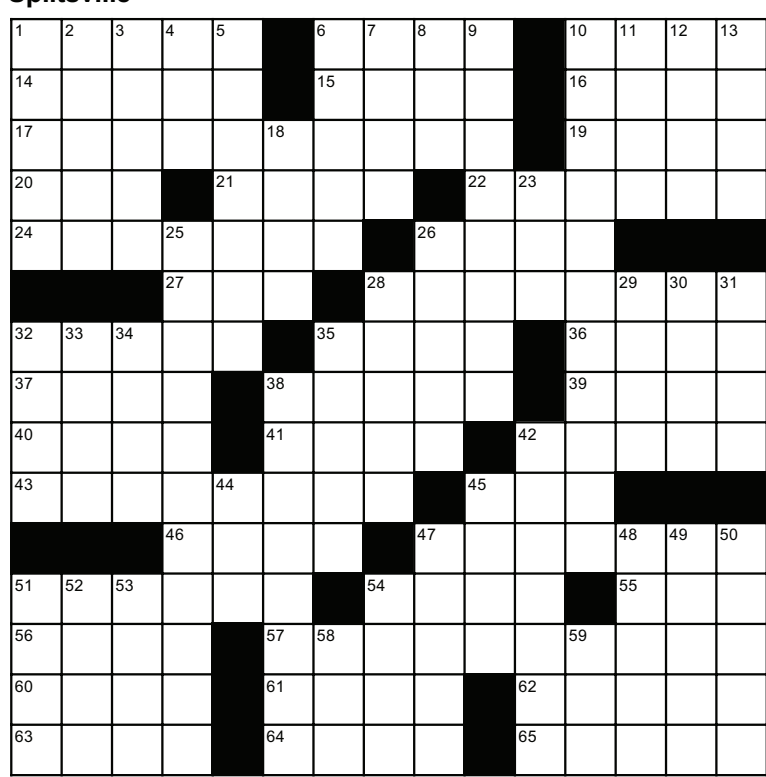
