

Golf team had top golfer, tied for first

Cowgirls lose tie-breaker get second place silver

The Cowgirls golf team tied for first but ended up with the silver medal after losing a tie breaker with Syracuse at the Scott City tournament Thursday.

Goodland had the top golfer, senior Eryn Topliff, who finished nine holes in 42 strokes. Senior Sammie Raymer finished third in 44 strokes. Also earning a medal was junior Chelsie Gausman in 47 strokes for eighth place. Sophomore Natasha Hillman finished in 54 strokes, sophomore Amber Douglas in 55 and senior Heidi Yonkey in 56.

Goodland and Syracuse both had team scores of 187, but the fifth person's score determined the tie-breaker, giving Syracuse the gold medal. Holcomb was third with 196, Lakin fourth with 208 and Oakley fifth with 214.

"I am very proud of the girls," said Coach Connie Livengood. "Eryn Topliff shot a very fine round of golf, a 42, to win the tournament. She did a good job in playing the

course. Sammie Raymer held her own with her 44, and Chelsie Gausman shot a good round considering she had a blow-up hole and shot a good score, 47."

Goodland also had the top golfer in junior varsity, Kirsten Topliff, who finished in 54 strokes. Freshman Ashley Garza was 13th in 73 strokes.

"All the girls played well," Livengood said. "All are continuing to get better, and all have had a good or bad round. It is now time that we hope we are going to start putting things together, as regionals are right around the corner, and it is great that we are putting pressure on the other teams."

"The team showed up to play golf, and it showed in their scores."

The girls' next action was to begin at 9 a.m. today at Ulysses. The girls will compete at 2 p.m. Thursday at Oakley and 8:30 a.m. Saturday at Lakin.

Tennis team loses close matches

The Cowgirls tennis team lost some close matches Thursday, ending up fifth out of nine teams at the Russell Invitational Tournament.

Two doubles teams and a singles player for Goodland fought the wind in Russell. Larned won the meet, Colby was second and Osborne third.

In No. 2 singles, Sandra Redlin played well all day, said Coach Wallace Hansen. She narrowly lost to Vine of Larned 8-5, came back to defeat Gustus of Quivera Heights 8-5 and then was beaten by Smith of Lyons 8-6 in a match Redlin led 6-3 at one point.

In No. 1 doubles, the Goodland duo of Kaitlyn Fugleberg and

Shonna Webster finished fourth. They beat Geist and Stroup of Osborne 8-1 in the first round. In the second round, they lost to Farley and K. Schmidt of Larned by 8-2. The Larned team went on to win the gold medal.

Fugleberg and Webster played a really good doubles team from Quivera Heights, the coach said, and the final score of 8-4 in favor of the Quivera team of Montoya and Kratzer doesn't indicate how the match really was. There were five deuce games, where each player had three points and the next player to win two points in a row would get the game, he said, and Quivera Heights won four of them. That

was the difference in the match, he said.

In No. 2 doubles, Kathy Wood and Heidi Lawson of Goodland finished 0-2 but had a chance to win a tie breaker match with Gregory and Oliver of Osborne. Osborne won it 8-7 (7-4). In a second match, the

Goodland duo lost to Milhoun and Kayla Schmidt of Larned 8-0.

Next action for the girls will be at 2 p.m. today at the Colby Invitational. The regional tournament will be at Colby on Thursday, Oct. 4, providing Goodland remains a Class 4A school, Hansen said.

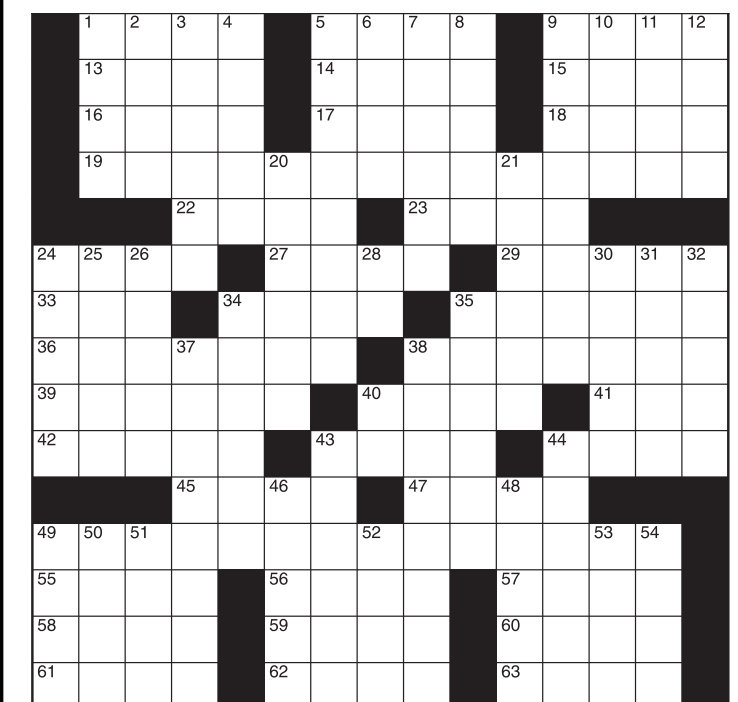

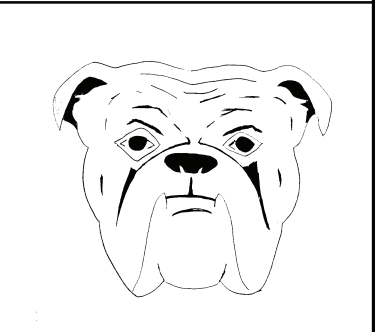
