

Cowgirls finish second

Five members of the Cowgirls golf team competed at Oakley Thursday, finishing second. Goodland had the second, fourth and fifth place medal winners.

The Cowgirls team score was 238. Oakley won the tournament with 212, and Colby was third with 245.

Senior Heidi Yonkey finished nine holes in 52 strokes for second place. Sophomore Amber Douglas and freshman Kirsten Topliff each finished in 55 strokes in a three-way tie for fourth. Douglas won the tie-breaker, and Topliff was fifth. Freshman Ashley Garza finished in 76 strokes, and Samantha Goalden, who joined the team two weeks ago, finished her first tournament in 84 strokes.

"The girls played the course well, and I enjoyed watching them," said Coach Connie Livengood. "Heidi Yonkey did a fantastic job placing second and shooting a 52. She has worked very hard this year and deserves the medal."

Kirsten Topliff did a great job as well, the coach said, as she had fallen earlier in the day and her hands were scraped pretty deep.

"She decided to play, and I am proud of that decision," Livengood said.

Douglas is staying right around the 55 mark, the coach said, and she placed with 55. Garza and Goalden are new this year, she said, and are

continuing to improve on certain parts of their game.

All in all, Livengood said, it was a great day.

The girls competed Saturday at Lakin, finishing fifth with a team score of 446. Syracuse won the tournament with 360.

Senior Sammie Raymer finished 18 holes in 101 strokes, junior Chelsea Gausman in 113, senior Eryn Topliff 115, Douglas 117, Yonkey 120 and sophomore Natasha Hillman 131.

"It was not the best performance for our team," said Coach Connie Livengood, "but you win as a team and you lose as a team. We needed to walk on the course ready to play, and we didn't."

"This team will bounce back; they are that kind of group. Golfing can be easy and it can be frustrating. The next performances will just depend on the girls and how they respond to the tournament. It's one of those tournaments that you forget about and go on to play against another course. This team will do it."

Regional will be at 8:30 a.m. Monday at Tamarisk Golf Course in Syracuse. Teams competing will be Colby, Goodland, Holcomb, Hugoton, Lakin, Oakley, Scott City-Scott Community, Sublette, Syracuse and Ulysses.

State competition for 4-3-2-1A girls golf will be Monday, Oct. 15, at Cottonwood Hills Golf Course in Buhler.

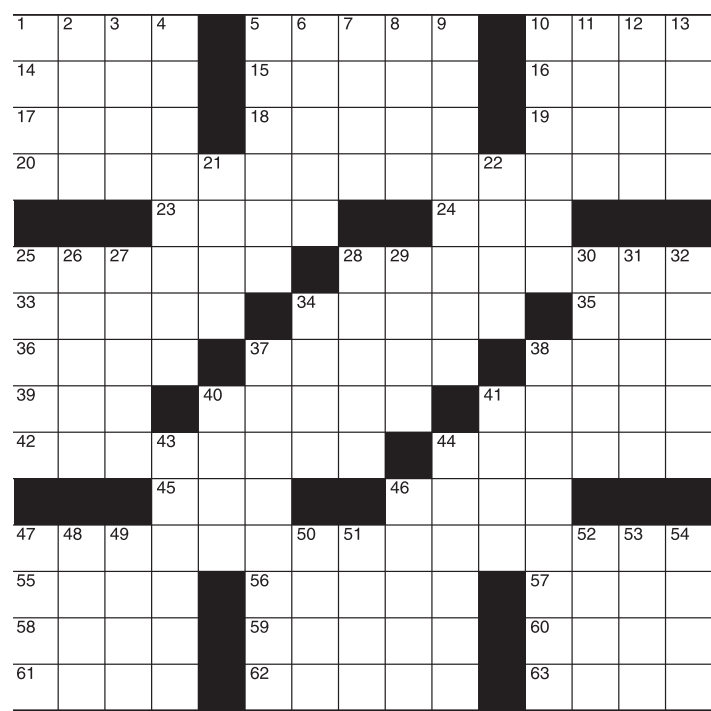
B Team results

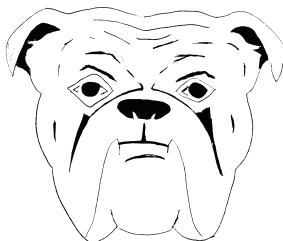
