# **Sports** Cowboys fall to Indians at homecoming

ntbetz@nwkansas.com With a couple of big plays and taking advantage of Cowboys turnovers, the Hays High Indians dampened the homecoming crowd on Friday with a 24-7 win.

The two teams came into the game with similar 1-3 records, and at times both teams seemed bent on giving the game away as each team lost three fumbles and had two passes intercepted.

The Indians had the better of it scoring on two runs of 50 and 48 yards by Jessie Stewart. The third Indian score came on a 13-yard pass from Kenton Rule to Ryan Rounkles with two seconds left in the half to make it 21-0.

The Indians final points came on a 33-yard field goal in the third quarter by Jay Wickham to make it 24-0.

The Cowboys did not give up and after the two teams traded interceptions the Indians fumbled at their 24-yard line and Cowboys Bob Doxon recovered with 5:35 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Cowboys quarterback Travis An-

gelos passed to Forrest Trachsel for a first down at the Indian 11. It took two tries, but Angelos connected with Brandon Rome in the end zone for the Cowboys touchdown with 4:58 left.

Ren Scherling's point after kick was good, making it 24-7.

At halftime Cowboys Tanner Smith was crowned homecoming King and Amanda Amthor was crowned homecoming Queen.

Cowboys Coach Jonathan Dansel praised his team and told them they have to keep fighting.

"I have faith in you," he said. "The coaches have faith in you and the fans have faith in you. We gave up a couple of big plays, and without them it would have been a different game.

"There will be a lot worse things in life, and we have to step up and face the disappointment. We will have to step it up this week to get ready for the next game."

Dansel and his players gathered in a circle after the game.

"This is the greatest sport in the world," Dansel said, "and we have played it."

Cowboys running back Casey Henderson (44) ran for 18 yards and a first down in the first quarter of the homecoming game on Friday. Henderson had 62 yards in the game plus several kick off and punt returns. The Cowboys lost to Hays High Indians 24-7.


## Junior Cowboys to play Saturday on home field


