

Bike show had 161 entries

Wet, windy weather didn't dampen the number of entrants to the Northwest Kansas Bike Show during the Flatlander Fall Festival, and the rain didn't stop the evening parade down Main.

Dave Daniels, one of the organizers, said 161 motorcycles were registered for the show, and he estimated another 20 were in town Saturday, Sept. 29.

The south wind did change the afternoon bike games course a bit, as the events were turned around, going from south to north rather than the traditional north to south.

Don Newell and Dennis Malsom kept the games moving but had some trouble adjusting the ball-drop tube without getting the ball stuck. In the game, the a passenger drops a tennis ball into the top of an angled plastic pipe, and the rider tries to time reaching the other end of the pipe at the same time the ball comes out to let the passenger catch it.

First time through the game, seven teams were able to catch the ball, and it took at least three more rounds to cut it down to three.

George Rodriguez and Breanna Johnson were declared the winners. Rodriguez seemed to be able to come to a stop and balance long enough for Johnson to wait for and catch the ball.

The team went on to win the ring toss and weiner bite. In the ring toss, the rider has to weave back and forth between two rows of cones while the partner tosses rings over each one. In the weiner bite, a hot dog is suspended from a wire and the rider has to approach and slow down for the partner to be able to reach up and bit it without using any hands.

Liby Worley and Randy Knox Jr. won the ball-on-cone game, where the rider weaves between the cones and the partner reaches out to put a tennis ball on top of each cone.

Craig and Britney Johnson won the water-balloon toss, where the rider drives under a suspended wire and the partner has to toss a water balloon over the wire and catch it without bursting the balloon.

Randy Knox Sr. of Burlington won the men's slow race and Nikki Knox of Burlington won the women's.

With a threat of rain, the parade got started about 15 minutes early Saturday night, and the riders who participated did get a bit wet as the rain started falling shortly after they started south on Main from the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall.

Sunday, the bikers met at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall for a church service and poker run.

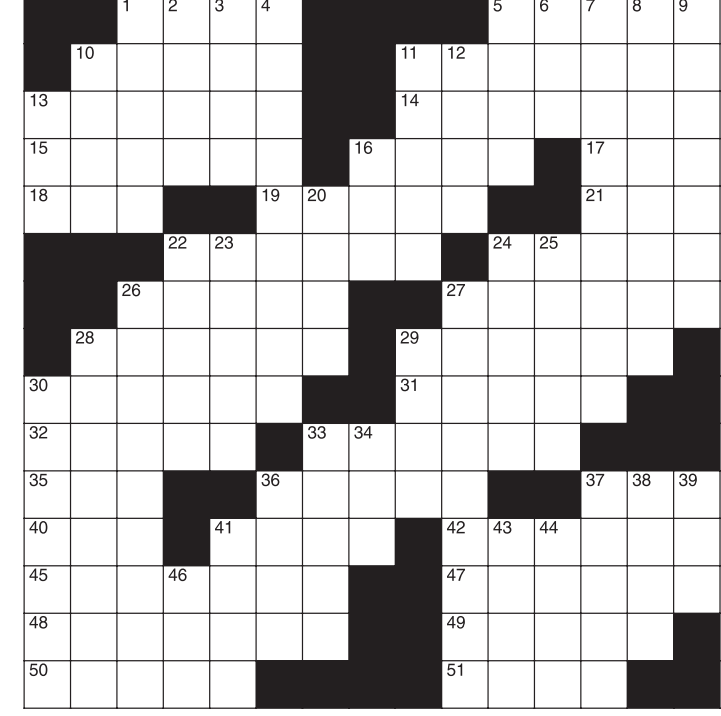
