In the weiner bite, a hot dog is suspended from a wire and the rider has to approach and slow down for the partner to be able to reach up and bit it without using any hands.

Liby Worley and Randy Knox Jr. won the ball-on-cone game, where the rider weaves between the cones and the partner reaches out to put a tennis ball on top of each cone.

Craig and Brittney Johnson won the water-balloon toss, where the rider drives under a suspended wire and the partner has to toss a water balloon over the wire and catch it without bursting the balloon.

Randy Knox Sr. of Burlington won the men's slow race and Nikki Knox of Burlington won the women's.




