Seventy-five years ago citizens from Sherman County and surrounding areas had the rare opportunity to see and hear Franklin Roosevelt, who was just beginning his push for the presidency, and Alf Landon, who was running for governor of Kansas.

In 1932 political candidates did not have the convenience of television to get their message to the voters, but they did have the opportunity to meet the people first hand and vise versa. Often it was from the platform of the train passing through or in one of the town's community buildings.

On account of the uncertainty of the time of arrival of the train, people from a distance began arriving early. Hundreds from Cheyenne and Wallace counties were here an hour early, and the steady stream of cars continued for some time. Local people, advised of the later time through the newspaper Wednesday evening, did not gather until nearly nine o'clock.

Governor Roosevelt's speech was short. He stated that he was making no effort to deliver a campaign address. He expressed his pleasure at being here again, reminding his hearers that he had passed this way in former years and he spoke of the many changes he noted in the country. One thing especially was the greater acreage of corn.

The New York governor qualified himself as "one with the farmers" by saying he was born on a farm fifty years ago and had remained a farmer ever since. This was somewhat of a

His campaign tour is an attempt to carry to the middle and western states the impression that he knows their needs in a national way, and has a program that will appeal to them.'
