Cowboys lose to Ulysses on the road


The Goodland Cowboys invaded Tiger country on Friday but were unable to derail the Ulysses team, losing 42-7 in the first of three district football games.

To have a chance to make the Class 4A playoffs, the Cowboys will have to win the next two games against Hugoton and Colby. The Cowboys' final home game of the regular season will be 6 p.m. on Friday when Hugoton comes to Cowboys Stadium for a district matchup. The final district and regular season game will be Thursday, Oct. 25 in Colby.

"We are going to keep working harder than ever this week and next," said Cowboys Coach Jonathan Dansel. "We are not out of a chance to make the playoffs.

"We prepared hard for Ulysses but things didn't turn out quite how we would have liked, but you have to pick yourself up and focus in on your next opponent.

"I didn't feel we played as hard as a team against Ulysses compared to the past weeks. The Tigers are an extremely good team, very well coached and one of the best in 4A, but I don't think they should have scored 42 points on our defense.
