One such pilot was especially grateful for the service he received and credited this airport for his record-setting win. A letter to that effect was published in The Goodland-News Republic.

Typewriter Thieves Apprehended
In Denver

The boys were brought back to Goodland by Sheriff D.D. Parker and are in the county jail awaiting trial. Their father was expected from Mankato today.

They refused to talk until he arrives.

It was reported by Denver police that they denied having taken the machines from the school, but the numbers on the machines identified them as the ones stolen.

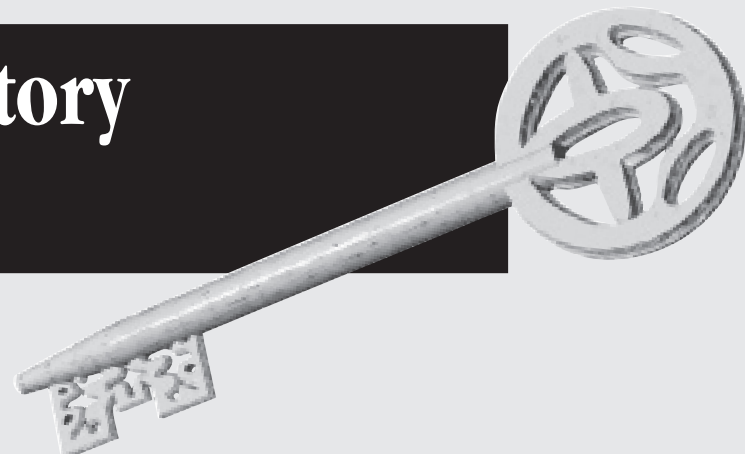

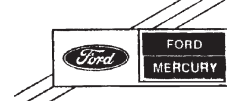
