

City of Goodland, Kan. water has high levels of nitrate

Quarterly Water sample results collected 10/9/07 showed nitrate levels of 12 mg/L. This is above the federal nitrate standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL). Nitrate in drinking water is a serious health concern for infants less than six months old. DO NOT GIVE THE WA-TER TO INFANTS UNDER SIX MONTHS OLD OR USE IT TO MAKE INFANT FORMULA

What should I do? DO NOT GIVE THE WATER

TO INFANTS. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. Blue baby syndrome is indicated by blueness of the skin. Symptoms in infants can develop rapidly, with health deteriorating over a period of days. If symptoms occur, seek medical attention immediately.



 DO NOT BOIL THE WATER. Boiling, freezing, filtering, or letting water stand does not reduce the nitrate level. Excessive boiling can make the nitrates more concentrated, because nitrates remain behind when the water evaporates.

 Adults and children older than six months can drink the contact Wayne Hill, City Mantap water (nitrate is a concern for infants because they can't process nitrates in the same way adults can.) However, if you are pregnant or have specific health concerns, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

 Nitrate in drinking water can come from natural, industrial, or agricultural sources (including septic systems and run-off). Levels of nitrate in drinking water can vary throughout the year. We'll let you know when the amount of

nitrate is again below the limit.

 You were initially notified of high nitrate levels on 3/20/07 Since that time we have been monitoring the nitrate concentration every three months. We have placed Well #3 on inactive emergency status to be used ir emergency situations such as fire fighting and drought unti further notification. Note that prior to 2007 we were meeting drinking water standards for nitrates on Well #3.
