NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Kansas Corporation Commission ("KCC") has established a public comment period and set three public hearings concerning two dockets relating to the proposed sale of Aquila, Inc. ("Aquila"). The first docket concerns Aquila's joint application with Black Hills Corporation ("Black Hills") and Black Hills/Kansas Gas Utility Company, LLC ("BH Kansas Gas"). The application is for approval of the sale and transfer of Aquila's Kansas gas distribution system and customers to BH Kansas Gas. The second application is a related docket filed by Great Plains Energy Incorporated (GPE), Aquila, and Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL) for approval for GPE (KCPL's parent company) to acquire Aquila's Missouri electric properties. Together, these two transactions are part of a five-state transaction which transfers Aquila's remaining public utility assets.

JOINT APPLICATION: KCC DOCKET NO. 07-BHGC-1063-ACQ
 In its joint application, Aquila, Inc., d/b/a Aquila Networks-KGO ("Aquila-KGO") and BH Kansas Gas have requested approval from the KCC for Aquila to sell all of Aquila's natural gas transmission and distribution facilities located in the state of Kansas to BH Kansas Gas and transfer Aquila's Certificate of Service to BH Kansas Gas. Approximately 106,000 Aquila gas customers affected by the sale/purchase transfer would become retail customers of BH Kansas Gas. BH Kansas Gas stated it would initially provide service at the same rates and terms currently in effect for like services provided by Aquila.

Black Hills and BH Kansas Gas propose to pay Aquila more than the regulatory book value of the Aquila property being acquired. The difference between the purchase price and the regulatory book value of the Aquila property is referred to as an acquisition premium. Whether or not the KCC will allow recovery of this premium in the rates paid by BH Kansas Gas customers is an issue that may be decided by the KCC during this proceeding.

The total estimated amount of acquisition premium, transaction, and

transition costs associated with the Black Hills/Aquila-KGO acquisition is approximately \$46 million. Black Hills wants to amortize and recover this amount over a 25-year period beginning January 1, 2010.

The Black Hills/Aquila-KGO transaction and the KCPL/Aquila Missouri transaction are conditioned upon the closing of the other transaction. However, KCPL's effective acquisition of Aquila's electric utility business in Missouri should have no impact on Aquila's current Kansas gas customers and there will be no affiliation between Black Hills/BH Kansas Gas and KCPL upon closing of the two transactions.

JOINT APPLICATION: KCC DOCKET NO. 07-KCPE-1064-ACQ
 In this joint application, GPE, Aquila, and KCPL have requested the KCC approve the acquisition of Aquila's Missouri electric assets by GPE. GPE and Aquila have previously committed to the KCC to obtain approval of this transaction.

KCPL also seeks approval to recover certain costs relating to its transaction in an amount equal to half of the savings it estimates will be generated over five years as part of its transaction. If approved, this cost recovery and savings retention would be through rates paid by KCPL's Kansas electric customers. Whether or not costs and retention of these savings will be allowed to be recovered in the rates paid by KCPL's Kansas electric customers are issues that will be decided by the KCC during this proceeding.
