Wind chills have different effect on plants

When the weather man reads the temperature on the evening weather map they often follow it with the wind chill.

The term sometimes used is "it feels like", which usually makes us want thicker coats and warmer gloves if we are headed out side. Wind chill can have a profound effect on humans and animals but the effect differs for plants. What effect does wind chill have on plants? With warm blooded animals and humans wind chill affects their ability to keep warm. However, plants do not respond to wind chill indexes as do warm-blooded animals because they do not need to maintain a temperature above that of their surroundings. For example, a wind chill of 40 degrees below zero at a temperature of zero degrees Fahrenheit will not cause any more cold injury to plant tissue than a wind chill index of 20 degrees below zero at zero degrees Fahrenheit. However, though the cold temperatures may not damage plants, wind alone is desiccating and can dry plant tissues. Plant tissues require moisture to survive and a high wind velocity can cause moisture loss. This desiccation may be great enough to injure or even kill tissue, particularly the smaller size wood as in peach twigs, apple spurs or blackberry canes. There is no scientific evidence to show that an increasing wind chill index will directly increase plant damage due to cold injury.
