## Cowgirls lose to Garden City

Shorthanded by illness the Cowgirls found it tough going against the Class 5A Garden City Lady Buffaloes on Tuesday at Max Jones Fieldhouse losing 61-40.

Coach Don Smith had said he was concerned about the health of the girls, and was down to nine girls in uniform with Courtney Sheldon, Alexis Bateman and Angie Hillmer unavailable. Whitney Schields, who was out of the Oberlin game on Friday was in uniform and came in off the bench on Tuesday.

In the first quarter the Cowgirls stayed close in the first half with the Buffaloes leading 10-6, but were down 17-10 at the end of the quarter. In the second quarter the Cowgirls were out scored 15 to 10 and down 32-20 at half time.

In the third quarter the Cowgirls again scored 10 points, but the Buffaloes had 17 to make the score 49-30.

The Cowgirls attempted to mount a late rally, scoring eight unanswered to open the fourth

and cut the Garden City lead to 11 with 4:31 left to play. Following a timeout, however, the Lady Buffaloes refocused to finish the game on a 12-2 tear to give them their victory, 61-40.

The Lady Buffaloes had good height inside with 6'3" Marisela Rodriguez in the center who caused problems for the Cowgirls trying to get shots.

Rodriguez had 10 points for the Buffaloes with eight of those in the first half and Caitlin Smith, a speedy point guard led the Buffaloes with 12 points. The Lady Buffaloes spread the scoring around with 10 different girls contributing to the 61 total points.

Senior Sammie Raymer led the Cowgirls with 18 points and junior Shelbi Hall had 12. Freshman Ashley Archer had 6 and Jade Herl and Schields each had 2.

Coach Smith got all of the girls on the bench into the game to give them some experience, and was pleased with the play of Erika Gonzales who led the

team with 8 rebounds, but did not score on any of her five shots from the field. Gonzales had 3 offensive and 5 defensive rebounds. Raymer had 5 rebounds, Herl 4 and Schields and Archer each had 3 and Hall had 1. The Cowgirls were out rebounded by the Buffaloes 29-24.

From long range the Cowgirls did not make any of the 8 shots taken while the Buffaloes hit on 1 of 9 shots for 11 percent. Goodland hit 44 percent from the floor (16 of 36) while the Buffaloes hit 57 percent (26 of 46). The Cowgirls hit 67 percent of their free throws (8 of 12) while the Buffaloes hit 46 percent (6 of 13).

The loss drops the Cowgirls record to 5-10, and they will be in St. Francis at 5:30 p.m. on Friday to face the Lady Indians in a Northwest Kansas league match-up.

On Saturday the Cowgirls will be back at Max Jones Fieldhouse at 5:30 p.m. to face another Class 5A school the Dodge City Lady Demons.

## Buffaloes run over Cowboys 75-33

The Garden City Buffaloes put on a show at Max Jones Fieldhouse on Tuesday as they used their speed and height to out run the Cowboys 75-33.

The Cowboys were playing without senior Tanner Smith who apparently broke his ankle at the game Friday in Oberlin, and were without senior Josh Duke who was ill.

Cowboy Coach Brad Bergsma said before the game that he did not see Smith coming back before the end of the season, and was doubtful they would have him back for sub-state.

The Cowboys found themselves in a hole quickly in the first quarter as the Buffaloes had an 11-0 run to start the game, and Goodland was down 19-8 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter the Buffaloes continued their scoring run taking a 37-8 lead before the

Cowboys got a basket with three minutes left in the half. The Buffaloes led 44-12 at half time.

The third quarter went much as the first two had with the Buffaloes leading 59-26 at the buzzer.

In the fourth quarter both teams began pulling out the starters and putting in younger players as the Buffaloes maintained their lead to win 75-33.

For the Buffaloes, junior William Groth led in scoring with 18 points, two of which came when a Bobby Wesley lay-up was about to trickled off the rim and the 6-foot-2 forward Groth reached out to dunk the ball. Groth, got another dunk on a breakaway in the third quarter.

The Cowboys had upset the Buffaloes in Garden City last year with the help of 18 points from

Smith and 18 from last year senior Nick Angelos.

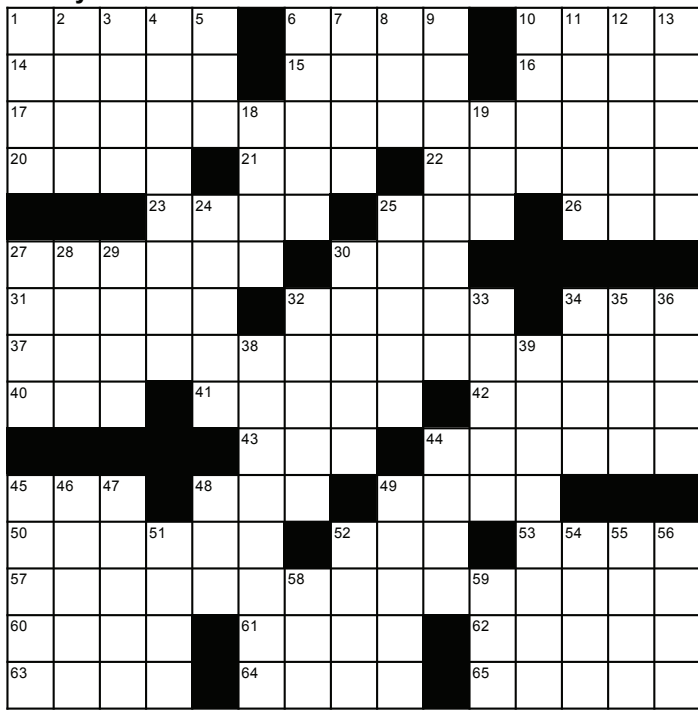
The loss gives the Cowboys a 6-9 record as they prepare to face the St. Francis Indians at 7 p.m. on Friday in St. Francis for a Northwest Kansas league game. The Cowboys are 3-0 in league play. On Saturday the Cowboys will be back at Max Jones Fieldhouse at 7 p.m. to face the Dodge City Demons.

Junior Greg Farris led the Cowboys with 9 points, senior Preston Dautel 7, Brandon Rome and Grant Wilkens each had 5, Forrest Trachsel had 4, Travis Angelos had 2 and Chris Irvin 1.

The Buffaloes shot 47 percent while the Cowboys hit 33 percent. Garden City out rebounded the Cowboys 45-37, and Goodland had 21 turnovers to 12 for Garden City.
