Screenings to be held to start school

The Goodland School District will have a combined kindergarten screening/enrollment registration from 8 a.m. to noon and 1 to 3 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, Feb. 19 and 20, at Emmanuel Lutheran Church, 222 W. 13.

The screening is for all children who will go to kindergarten this fall or will be five on or before Sunday, Aug. 31, 2008.

Children must be accompanied by an adult. The process will take about an hour. The screening involves a hearing exam, vision test, speech assessment, developmental screening and immunization record check. Appointments can be made by calling Shawn Gastineau at North Elementary School, (785) 890-3912.

Parents should bring the child's

immunization record, a certified copy of their birth certificate and a copy of the child's social security card. Shots and a health assessment have to be done before the child can start school. Immunizations can be gotten through a family doctor or the Sherman County Health Department.

To get a certified copy of a birth certificate write to the State Capitol Building, Department of Vital Statistics, for the state in which the child was born. The address for Kansas is Kansas Department of Health & Environment, Center for Health and Environmental Statistics, 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 120, Topeka, Kan. 66612-2221. The fee for one copy is \$12 and \$7 for each additional copy ordered at the same time.

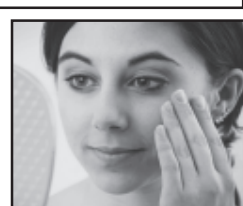
