

Cowboy wrestlers fought hard at dual

The Cowboys fought hard but lost against the St. Francis Indians in a wrestling dual at home Friday. Goodland finished second with nine junior varsity and three varsity wrestlers competing at the Stratton, Colo., tournament Saturday.

Goodland won just three matches in the dual and had two forfeits against St. Francis for a final score of 38-25.

The St. Francis dual was a hard-fought dual, said Coach Joseph Sramek; St. Francis came ready to wrestle and showed it on the mat.

"On a positive note," he said. "We are starting to get everyone healthy for regional. We did lose the dual, but I felt most of the wrestlers gave a great effort and did not give up."

Senior Ren Scherling pinned St. Francis junior Talen Jones at 215 pounds, junior Ryan Taylor had a major decision over junior Scott Ford 15-4 at 160 and junior Keegan Smith beat junior Jesse Pacheco 6-2 at 145.

Seniors A.J. Stephens and Bob Daxon got forfeits at 140 and 285. Both schools were open at 103.

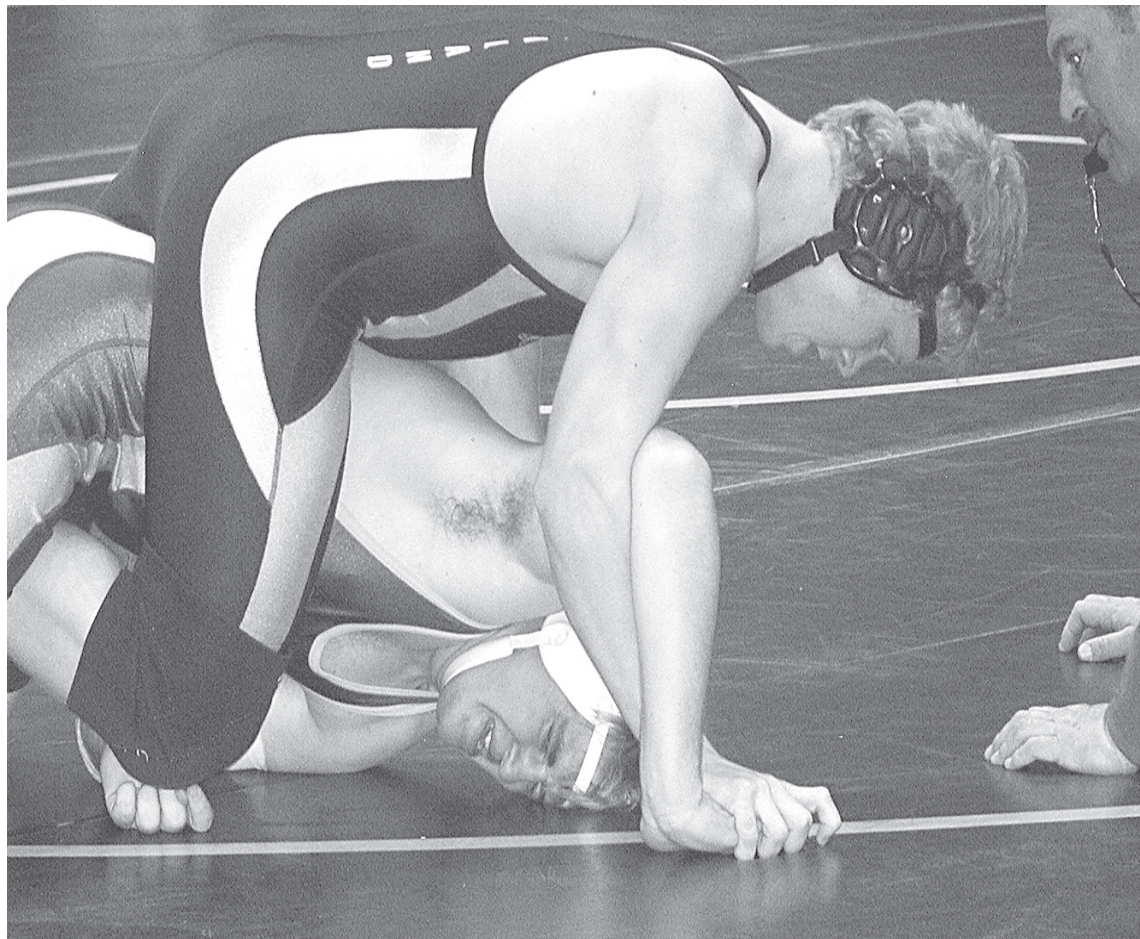
Goodland's losses in the dual:

Freshman Kayler Rietcheck was absent due to a family commitment.

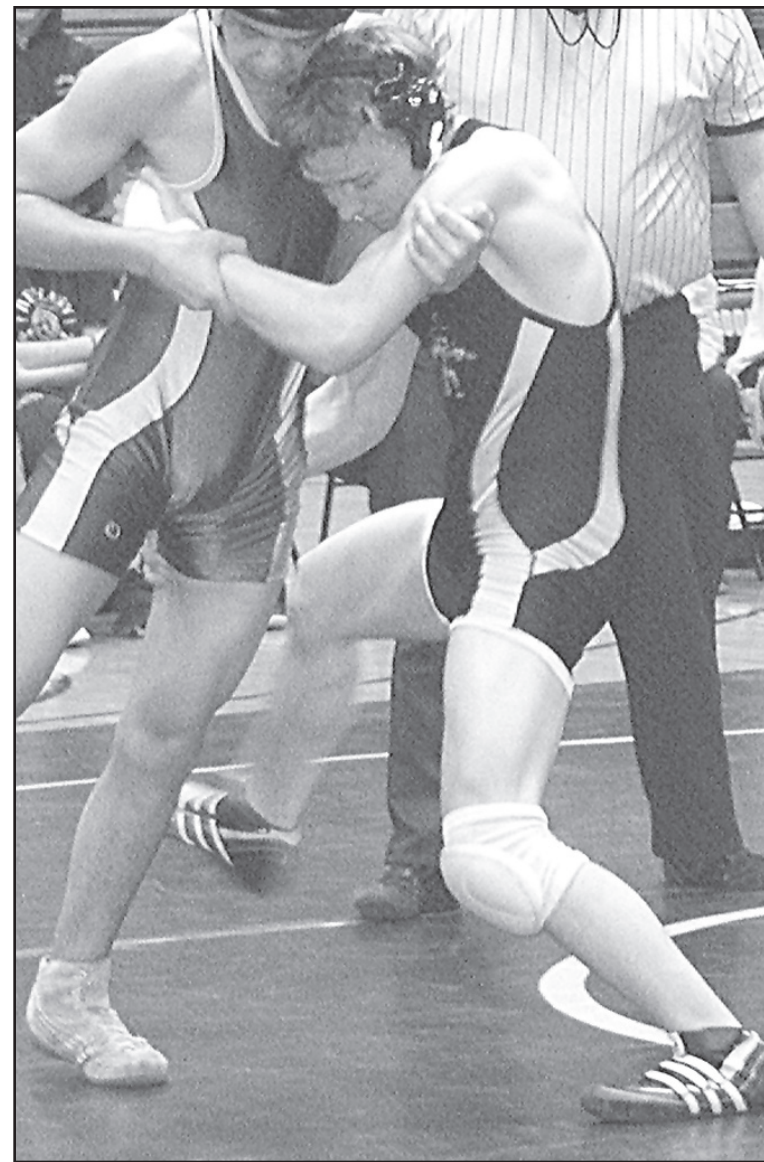
- 130 senior Josh Carpenter pinned freshman Nathan Deeds.

- 189 senior David Guthmiller had a major decision over junior Fernando Martinez 10-2.

The senior wrestlers and their parents were honored for Parents' Night, and the senior wrestlers did a special presentation for Dennis Klinge and Peggy Klinge, parents of their classmate Michael J. Klinge, who died in a car accident early in

their freshman year. Mrs. Klinge was present, as the boys read a poem in her son's honor and presented memorabilia.

Stratton was a varsity tournament which allowed junior varsity wrestlers to compete, Sramek said. Goodland had four champions, a second-place wrestler and a fourth-place wrestler and finished third with 118 points. Goodland X had a second-place wrestler but no score.

Merino, Colo., won the tournament with 155 points, and Stratton was second with 128. Clear Creek High School of Evergreen, Colo., was fourth with 94, Colby fifth with 82, Sedgwick County, Colo., (Julesburg) sixth with 56, Wray, Colo., seventh with 41.5, Burling-

ton eighth with 23, Cheyenne Wells, Colo., ninth with 19 and Byers, Colo., 10th with 17.5.

"I was very pleased with the wrestlers' performances," Sramek said.

Johnson pinned Brady Rundel of Colby in four minutes, 30 seconds, at 171 and then beat Zach Jackson of Wray 6-2. Sophomore Paul Starr competed for Goodland X in the same bracket, pinning Dominic Archambault of Clear Creek X in the first round, then beating Tuff Gibson of Merino 4-0. Johnson and Starr competed for the championship, and Johnson won 8-2.

Ryan Taylor had a bye in his first round at 160, then pinned Andy Taylor of Stratton X, had a major decision, 10-1, over Jordan Voss of Colby and beat David Brachtenbach

of Stratton 4-2 for the championship.

Eduardo Martinez competed for Goodland X at 160 and was pinned by Kyle Kasper of Merino in the first round. He had a bye in the next round, then was pinned by Jake Callaghan of Clear Creek.

At 275, sophomore Jay Cotter was undefeated in round robin play, winning the championship. He pinned Uriel Zamimipa of Cheyenne Wells in 54 seconds, pinned Steven Carr of Clear Creek, pinned Alex Steward of Byers in 1:30, Josh Rodriguez of Stratton in 5:07 and Eli Cordoba of Wray in 1:41.

Delgado pinned Michael Gallegos of Clear Creek in 3:47 at 135 pounds. He then pinned Kaid Wark of Colby in 1:10 and then Deryk

Russell of Merino in 5:30 for the championship.

Sophomore Hector Sarinana competed for Goodland X at 152, being pinned by Tyrel Jacobson of Byers in the first round and then by Tyson Mitchek of Cheyenne Wells.

Junior Tanner Oharrh took second in round robin action at 215 with the second best record, 4-1. He pinned Kyle Cox of Colby in two minutes, Nathan Quigliano of Colby X in 1:02, beat Tony Wakefield of Sedgwick County 2-0, pinned Tyson Urruthia of Merino in 1:02 but was pinned by Christian Hornung of Stratton.

Junior Bryan Gray lost to Kalen Rasumussen of Colby in round

one at 152 pounds. He then beat Eric Boone of Stratton by major decision, 16-3, and pinned Tyrel Jacobson of Byers in 2:17 and faced Rasmussen again for third place, losing 8-3 and taking fourth place.

Senior Martin Stadelmann was pinned by Wyatt Barber of Merino, John Howard of Clear Creek and David Bunch of Byers at 130 pounds.

Junior T.J. Freeman was pinned by Byron Davis of Stratton and John Barker of Merino at 145 pounds.

Also at 145, sophomore Savannah Short competed for Goodland X and was pinned by Cody Rober of Sedgwick County and James Dwyer of Cheyenne Wells.
