## Wrestlers win final dual before regionals

The next day, the junior varsity squad was at the Bill Voss Novice tournament at Colby.

In Oakley, the Cowboys pinned three Plainsmen, won four matches by decision and received one for-

Freshman Nathan Deeds pinned Michael Halblieb at 130 pounds, junior Keegan Smith pinned Brett Ringelman at 145 and senior Bob Doxon pinned Zach Riggs at heavyweight. Junior Kade Sheldon beat Andrew Peterson 7-2 at 112, sophomore Lorenzo Delgado beat Kyle Zerr 6-4 at 135, senior A.J. Stephens beat Brad Halblieb 4-1 at 140 and junior Vance Johnson beat Ethan Jirak 2-1 at 171. Junior Fernando Martinez received a forfeit at 189.

Junior Ryan Taylor lost 5-2 to Kelly Younkin at 160, freshman Seth Miller was pinned by Jace Campbell at 119, freshman Kayler Rietcheck was pinned by Steve Samuelson at 125, junior T.J. Freeman was pinned by Cody Stewart at 152 and senior Ren Scherling lost by technical fall to Aaron Racette at 215. Freeman was filling in for Aaron Deeds, who hurt his knee in practice and sat out the dual to be ready for regionals.

"I was very pleased with our performance before regional," said Coach Joseph Sramek. "We got a good dual win against a very good Oakley team and finished our season with a dual record of 12-5."

The regional tournament will be at Clearwater High School southwest of Wichita. It will feature some of the best wrestlers in the state, Sramek said, and Colby will be the favorite going into the tournament.

"I feel that our team is prepared to compete well at regional," he said, "and with a good tournament, we could qualify several wrestlers

Also competing at regional will be Andale, Buhler, Cheney, Clearwater, Haven, Hesston, Hugoton, Lindsborg-Smoky Valley, Mulvane, Nickerson, Pratt, Russell, Ulysses and Wellington.

State wrestling will be Friday and Saturday, Feb. 22 and 23, at the Salina Bicentennial Center.


The junior varsity wrestlers finished up their season at the Colby tournament, Sramek said.

Sophomore Jay Cotter placed first at 215, sophomore Paul Starr was second at 171, junior Bryan Gray third at 145 and junior Tanner Oharrah fourth at 215.

Senior Martin Stadelman, junior T.J. Freeman, sophomore Savanah Short and sophomore Hector Sarinana did not place.

"I just want to thank these kids with all hard work and effort that they put into season," Sramek said. "They did an excellent job all year and did what it took to become better at wrestling."

### Cowboys fall to 10th ranked Colby Eagles

ntbetz@nwkansas.com The Colby Eagles clinched the Northwest Kansas League title by beating the Goodland Cowboys on Tuesday at the Colby Community Building, 65-48.

The two teams had been tied in league play before the game. The Eagles, ranked 10th in Class 4A in several statewide polls, remain undefeated in the league with a 6-0 league record and are 14-4 for the season. The Cowboys fell to 5-1 in the league and 8-11 for the season.

Tuesday, the Cowboys fell behind in the first quarter 14-4. They tied the game at 14 early in the second quarter on a 10-point run. Then the Eagles went on an 11-point run to take the lead, 25-14. The Cowboys tried again to come back with a six-point run, cutting the Eagles' lead to 31-24 at half time.

The Cowboys got within 2 points, 36-34, half way through the third quarter. The Eagles responded with another run to lead 46-36 at the end of the period.

The Cowboys cut the lead back to single digits in the first part of the fourth quarter, but the Eagles went on another run to lead 57-40 with 4:38 left. The Cowboys tried again, but the Eagles scored the last points with about two minutes left to make it 65-48, then ran the clock out.

Cowboys Coach Brad Bergsma said he thinks Colby will be the top seed in the substate, noting that the Eagles are ranked in the top 10 in

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"Last night they played like it," Bergsma said. "Colby players Ethan Stover and Levi Schlick are both very good high school basketball players, and we didn't do enough to slow them down."

Stover was the high scorer for Colby with 24 points, the first eight points in the first quarter. Sclick was the other Eagle in double figures

"I thought defensively that was the most hustle we've seen out of our kids all year," Bergsma said, "and I was very proud of their ef-

"Offensively, we looked good at times with our execution. However, we continue to struggle with our patience. The majority of our turnovers last night were unforced, and I felt like our shot selection could have been better." Junior Brandon Rome led the

Cowboys with 13 points and had the teams first four points in the first quarter, with the first of two baskets coming with six minutes left and the second about a minute later on a pass from junior Greg Farris.

Senior Grant Wilkens had 10 points, junior Travis Angelos 9, Farris and senior Forrest Trachsel 6 each and senior Josh Doke had 4.

The Cowboys shot 35 percent (17 for 35) and had 20 turnovers to 13 for the Eagles.

"I told the kids last night that they should be excited," Bergsma said, "because we didn't play near our

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best basketball, yet were right in the game until the three-minute stretch

The Cowboys will be in Hoxie tonight for the last game of the regular season, and Bergsma said it will be a tough game. He said he thinks the boys can win if they
