He said the lead changed several times in the fourth quarter.

"Hoxie was making three-pointers and we were making two-pointers," Smith said. "We took the lead by one point with less than one minute left.

"We had the ball, but Hoxie stole it and made a shot that put them up by one. We had the ball to tie or win, and took a time out with 13 seconds left.'

Smith said he set up a final play, but it did not work.

"I am not sure why it didn't work," Smith said, "but we did not get the shot. We did not get a shot off and Hoxie got the ball. We fouled them and they made one free throw to make it a two-point win."

Smith said the Cowgirls played well against the Hoxie full court press.

"We had good percentages and the game was close in many ways," he said. "A win would have been exceptionally nice, but we had a lot of good positives in this game. Our effort was good getting on the loose ball.
